UPCOMING FIELD TRIPS AND EVENTS

Beginning birders are welcome on all field trips. Membership in the BSG is encouraged but is not required for participation in field trips. Field trips will **LEAVE** the designated meeting place at the time posted for each field trip. Plan to arrive early for field trip orientation and any carpooling/caravanning arrangements.

What to bring on field trips: binoculars, two-way radios, scope, if you have one, snacks, and drinks. Unless otherwise noted, field trips will take place rain or shine, so bring rain gear if the weather's threatening.

THE BIG SIT! AT THE RED RIVER NWR

This will be eighth straight year that BSG sitters will sit the Big Sit. This year, the Sit is moving to the Red River National Wildlife Refuge, where it will be the opening event to kickoff National Wildlife Refuge Week. Sitters count birds observed or heard from within a 17-foot diameter circle. The Big Sit officially begins at midnight and ends 24 hours later; BSG sitters have always been in the field by 6:30 a.m., manning the circle continuously until at least 7:30 p.m. Any Sitters wishing to man the circle before 6:30 a.m. will need to contact Nancy Menasco so we can make arrangements to let you in the gate. Sitters may come and go at will. Signs along the refuge road will lead you to the circle. Parking will be available near the circle.

Founded by the New Haven, Connecticut, Bird Club and now hosted by Bird Watcher's Digest magazine, the Big Sit is an annual, international, noncompetitive

birding event. It is sponsored nationally by Swarovski Optik, Alpen Optics, and Wild Bird Centers. 2008 will mark the 14th Annual Big Sit. From its beginnings as a strictly North American affair, the Big Sit has grown to include teams all over the world. Swarovski Optik donates \$500 to the team who gets the "Golden Bird." A bird species is selected by random drawing from all bird species sighted. All teams listing that species are entered in the random drawing for the Golden Bird. The winning circle then chooses a non-profit environmental-based organization to be the recipient of the \$500.

Directions to the refuge: From the intersection of US 71 (Barksdale Boulevard) and Jimmie Davis Highway (LA 511) in Bossier City, go south about one-half mile on US 71 and turn right (west) on Sunflower Road. Proceed to the end of the road to the refuge entrance. The refuge manager is Pat Stinson. The refuge phone number is 742-1219.

What to bring: binoculars, scope, field guides, chair, hat, mosquito repellent, sunscreen, drinks, breakfast, lunch, supper, snacks.

LOUISIANA ORNITHOLOGICAL SOCIETY FALL MEETING, LAFAYETTE, LA

Meet at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' office near the dam at 8:00 a.m. We will bird in the area around the office for awhile so that we don't leave anyone behind.

Persons using WMAs for any purpose must possess one of the following: a valid Wild Louisiana Stamp, a valid Louisiana fishing license, or a valid Louisiana hunting license. Persons younger than 16 or older than 60 years of age are exempt from this requirement. Licenses may be purchased at most sporting goods stores, by calling the Louisiana Department of Wildlife

and Fisheries toll-free at 1-888-765-2602, or online at www.wlf.louisiana.gov.

Directions: From Shreveport or Bossier City, go east on I-20. At I-20 Exit 33 (Haughton/Fillmore), go left (north) on LA 157 a little less than 8 miles to Bellevue. At Bellevue, turn right on Bodcau Dam Road. Follow Bodcau Dam Road; it will go through the WMA Recreation Areas and across the spillway. The Corps office is located on the road that leads to your left on the far side of the dam. You can see the office and the Durden House from the Bodcau Dam Road. The trip takes about 45 minutes from southeast Shreveport.

ALASKA BIRDING, ANCHORAGE, GAMBELL AND NOME, JUNE 2008

Mike Musumeche and I participated in a Victor Emanuel Nature Tour (VENT) in June 2008 that took us from south Louisiana to Alaska. We arrived in Anchorage a day early and birded the next day with Dianne Toebe, a local birder we met through Birders' Exchange. We had a whorl wind tour of local birding sites in Anchorage picking up Barrow's Goldeneye, Pacific Loon, Red-throated Grebe, Hudsonian Godwit, Mew and Glaucous-winged Gulls, Arctic Tern, and Gray Jay. A special treat was a pair of American Dippers at a nest on a dam at the Elmendorf Air Force Base Salmon Hatchery.

Gambell

We met David Wolf and Louise Zemaitis, two of our VENT guides, and the rest of our group that evening. We left for Gambell via Nome mid-morning the next

day. Kevin Zimmer, our VENT leader, met us in Nome. Much to our surprise, we barely got settled at the Bering Air terminal in Nome before we boarded the relatively small twin-engine plane that accommodated the 17 of us and all of our food. Within an hour, we saw Gambell at the northern end of St. Lawrence Island and, about 40 miles to the west, the snow and ice covered mountains in Siberia.

One has to visit Eskimo villages to appreciate what greeted us. A number of Gambell residents drove their All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) to the tarmac of the air strip as a form of recreation. Our luggage and food were loaded onto ATV carts and we were soon walking on the infamous Gambell gravel to the inn, a quarters building erected a few years ago for construction workers. It was warm and comfortable with warm showers but the best way to describe it as a place to stay was to call it "adequate."

Walking through gravel at a construction yard is child's play compared to walking in Gambell gravel. We passed racks of drying seal and walrus meat. We were cautioned to be discreet about taking pictures in the area as the Eskimo residents were concerned about perceived ridicule of their cultural ways. The homes and buildings were all simple in construction and elevated above ground level.

When we arrived, the sky was clear, the winds were mild, and the temperature was around 45 F. By early evening, the sky clouded and temperatures dropped into the 30's F with some very light snow and the wind picked up. We made a sea watch after walking through the Near Boneyard and seeing the ubiquitous Snow Buntings and Lapland Longspurs. We saw thousands of alcids flying to and from their nesting sites on the mountain that overlooks Gambell on the eastern side of the point jutting into the Arctic Ocean. Ducks, loons, gulls, murrets, guillemots, auklets, and puffins were everywhere. Clouds of these birds swirled in the distance around the mountain.

The boneyards are the second feature after the Gambell gravel that folks encounter. The boneyards are middens where the residents, through the millennia, have left the bodies of their subsistence hunting culture food sources, whales, walruses, and seals. There are numerous holes in the boneyards where the residents dig for walrus ivory and artifacts. The vagrant Eurasian birds that draw birders to Gambell gravitate to the boneyards and find shelter and food in the holes. So, every time we went out, we went through a boneyard. There are three boneyards, the Near Boneyard between the village and the "airport", the Far Boneyard between the village and the mountain, and the Round Boneyard between the Far Boneyard and the village.

We had weather that ranged from heavy wet snow to heavy fog to bright, sunny calm, almost warm weather. Troutman Lake, just south of Gambell, was covered with ice during our 4 day stay. We had at least one day with all three forms of weather while at Gambell. However, there was no pack ice and we found no Ross's or Ivory Gulls.

Nasty weather kept the Gambell residents indoors and put birds on the ground. During nice weather, the young people had a very annoying habit of shooting at birds in the boneyards with air rifles and using 0.22 caliber rifles to practice marksmanship on birds swimming in the surf along the beach.

Our best birding day involved pretty heavy wet snow from dawn into mid-afternoon. That was the day we had Common Ringed-Plover, Gray-tailed Tattler, Rock Sandpiper, and Jack Snipe. Jack Snipe had been reported by birders who had been to Gambell the previous week but we found it only one day. The bird was so unique that it was a life bird for all three of our VENT guides. When we located it, we called Louise Zemaitis who came from the inn via ATV taxi. We closed in on the bird which held in a protected spot in the marsh on the north side of the Troutman Lake. It was hunkered down and we were able to watch it for about half an hour as it fed and rested. The golden highlights on the body and wings stood out against dark background feathers. Later, four of us walked to the south end of the lake and were greeted by a Gray-tailed Tattler, the only one seen well on the trip, feeding on stickleback minnows as close as 10 feet from us.

During sea watches special seabirds included Arctic and Yellow-billed Loons and Spectacled, King, and Stellar's Eiders. Harlequin and Long-tailed Ducks regularly flew past us on regular basis. It was amusing to see most flocks of murrets being led by one or more puffins. There were so many murrets and enough guillemots that we left Gambell being able to separate Common and Thick-billed Murrets and Black and Pigeon Guillemots with ease. One sea watch generated our only Dovekie of the trip flying near enough the beach to easily pick up its field marks.

Our last day on Gambell emphasized the iffy nature of visits there. We were to leave at 10:30 AM but the fog was so thick that the plane could not land. Several of us went to the Far Boneyard and walked across the gravel to the base of the mountain. We passed the marsh on the north side of the lake and saw unique Long-tailed Jaeger behavior. A pair was flying along sharing vole parts in mid-air. Shortly thereafter we watched a lone jaeger catching and dispatching another vole. Our group was able to get up close views of various auklets that were low on the mountain and unwilling to fly out to feed

because of the heavy fog. As we walked back to the inn, we got a call on our radio to let us know that a plane was on the landing strip at St. Lawrence Island's other village and could take 7 of us to Nome within the next hour. So, we picked up our pace in the unforgiving gravel.

While we had a quick lunch, we drew tabs to see who got to go to Nome. I was one of the lottery winners and was able to enjoy a nice room at the motel in Nome by mid-afternoon. Fortunately, the plane that took me to Nome was able to turn around immediately and recover the rest of our group so everyone had a very comfortable night. However, there was no guarantee that any of us would have gotten away from Gambell that day or for a few days afterwards!

Nome

Nome was hardly a thriving metropolis but it has three roads that go 60-70 miles out into the hinterland allowing marsh, estuary, bay and seaside, tundra, and mountain birding. We were even able to reach the end of the Council Road where the "Tundra Meets the Taiga."

Nome is billed as the Ivory Capitol of Alaska and was the Gold Capitol of the state in years past. Mining equipment and abandoned gold dredges are found all around Nome and outlying area. The railroad to nowhere complete with rusting locomotives and rolling stock lay in a marsh along the Council Road. Small one or two man floating dredges are found along the beach front where entrepreneurs continue to mine for gold in the shallow waters there. We also learned a bit of trivia about the legendary western lawman Wyatt Earp who completed his long career in Nome!

We had two full days in Nome. Our first day started with heavy, wet snow fall and we set out along the Kougarok Road with very little to be seen through foggy van windows and near white out conditions within 50 yards of the road. But, by the time we had traveled about 45 minutes, we were out of the snow and into clearing conditions. We were able to view a female Gyrfalcon on a nest as the clouds lifted. Several Willow Ptarmigans were encountered and we also found a very cooperative Rock Ptarmigan gave us wonderful views. We were also treated to calling and displaying Willow Warblers and Bluethroats. At another stop we had Say's Phoebe, Surf-bird, and American Tree and Golden-crowned Sparrows. We stopped in a boggy area for lunch and located a female Goshawk on a nest and later watched a Gyrfalcon flying nearby.

After lunch, we finally arrived at Coffee Dome and started our trek up adjacent Curlew Dome to seek the Bristle-thighed Curlew, the rarest shorebird in North America. We were given a thorough briefing on

separating Whimbrel from Bristle-thighed Curlew and advised that it was important to not only watch our footing but watch out for Grizzly Bears. The sky was clear, there was little breeze, and we quickly started shedding heavy outer ware! Within a short time, a large shorebird was spotted. And, we got a great field lesson about why we were viewing a Whimbrel so we could separate it from our real quarry. After about 45 minutes, we were spread out hoping to locate a bird that often seeks shade in scrub willow in the mountainside tundra when it is clear and "hot." Fortunately, a curlew appeared at the end of the line near a cove of willows. Over the next 30-40 minutes, everyone got really good views of the curlew and we even got to within 30 yards of the bird. What a treat!

After we got back to the vans, it took a couple of hours to get back to Nome with some stops along the way that generated two Northern Shrikes and a Golden Eagle on a nest. Triangular-shaped snow plow guides were found at regular intervals along all of Nome's roads and we had a really good view of a resting Long-tailed Jaeger resting less than 5 yards from our vans.

The next day we were off along the coast on the Council Road and made several stops at inlets where streams entered the bay. Slaty-backed Gull was a lifer for a number of folks at our first stop.

Our next stop at another inlet generated my last lifer for the trip, Red-necked Stint. It is a good thing we had guides as many of us, me included, might have passed the bird off as just another peep.

Cape Nome was a granite promontory extending into the sea. We had excellent views of Harlequin Duck, Black and White-winged Scoters, and Pelagic Cormorants.

We had good views of breeding waterfowl in the marshy estuary inland from the coastal road as we proceeded south. It was a good thing we had two vans as the trailing van picked up several distant geese feeding with a flock of Brant that turned out to be several Emperor Geese. And, during one stop, a single Yellow-billed Loon flew by near enough and slow enough to give everyone a great view, much better than the views we had at Gambell, of this hard to find bird.

Around 4 PM, we finally got to the end of the road at Council City. The spruce forest harbored nesting Bohemian Waxwings and we got excellent views of birds that responded, after a bit of work, to tapes. We heard at least two Varied Thrushes calling away from the road but never managed to see one. Yellow, Yellow-rumped, Blackpoll and Wilson's Warblers were present in the forest habitat along with Gray Jays.

We started back to Nome and found both Northern Wheatear in hill side habitat and a Black Turnstone in

the marsh. We passed thousands of waterfowl including many Common Eiders.

The next and final morning, we made a trip on the northeast side of Nome. We missed Ring-necked Duck and Rusty Blackbird, both of which would have been trip birds and one, the Rusty Blackbird, would have been a lifer for one member of our party. But, we missed both birds. A male dipper entertained us with quite a song melody. An Orange-crowned Warbler was a trip bird and put on a display on a power line.

We left Nome in early afternoon for Anchorage. That ended our birding in Alaska but not our memories.

Mammals

Mammals are a bit difficult to see because they are often cryptic. But, at Gambell, we saw Gray Whale, Arctic Fox, Tundra Vole, and Short-tailed Ground Squirrel (also called Low Brush Grizzly!). Around Nome, we had Moose, Musk Ox (an introduced species), Red Fox, Arctic Hare, and Short-tailed Ground Squirrel. We were on the alert for Grizzly Bears but never saw the first one and were not especially disappointed that we were not disturbed while birding on Curlew Mound!

Minutes of the Regular Meeting
June 10, 2008, 6:30 p.m.
Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Program—Clyde Massey took a two week birding tour of Panama with Victor Emanuel Nature Tours. He discussed his trip and the birds he saw. He also showed a video of the birds of Panama made by Bill Wayman from New Orleans who was also a participant in tour.

Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Treasurer's Report—Jean Trahan reported that for the month ending May 31, 2008, the club had \$5,766.27 in the bank. 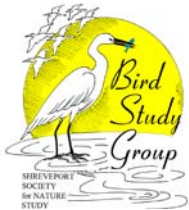
