### UPCOMING FIELD TRIPS AND EVENTS

Beginning birders are welcome on all field trips. Membership in the BSG is encouraged but is not required for participation in field trips. Field trips will **LEAVE** the designated meeting place at the time posted for each field trip. Plan to arrive early for field trip orientation and any carpooling or caravanning arrangements.

What to bring on field trips: binoculars, two-way radios, scope, if you have one, snacks, and drinks. Unless otherwise noted, field trips will take place rain or shine, so bring rain gear if the weather's threatening.

#### BAYOU BODCAU WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA

Meet at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' office near the dam at 8:00 a.m. We will bird in the area around the office for a while so that we don't leave anyone behind.

Bodcau WMA has a variety of habitat from bottomland hardwood swamp to dry, grassy fields and thickets. The locations we will bird will be dependent on weather and accessibility. Possible birds of interest or specialty birds include: Blue-winged Teal, Hooded Merganser, Wild Turkey, Barred Owl, White-breasted Nuthatch, Sedge Wren, and a variety of sparrows including Bachman's (difficult in winter but present), Field, Henslow's (rare), LeConte's, Fox, and Lincoln's.

Persons using WMAs for any purpose must possess one of the following: a valid Wild Louisiana Stamp, a valid Louisiana fishing license, or a valid Louisiana hunting license. Persons younger than 16 or older than 60 years of age are exempt from this requirement. Licenses may be purchased at most sporting goods stores or by calling the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries toll-free at 1-888-765-2602 or contacting them online at [www.wlf.louisiana.gov](http://www.wlf.louisiana.gov).

Directions: From Shreveport or Bossier City, go east on I-20. At I-20 Exit 33 (Haughton/Fillmore), go left (north) on LA 157 a little less than 8 miles to Bellevue. At Bellevue, turn right on Bodcau Dam Road. Follow Bodcau Dam Road; it will go through the WMA Recreation Areas and across the spillway. The Corps office is located on the road that leads to your left on the far side of the dam. You can see the office and the Durden House from Bodcau Dam Road. The trip takes about 45 minutes from Southeast Shreveport.

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### LEAST TERNS THROUGH THE YEARS

I am curious to understand how much damage is done to **Least Terns** that miss an entire year of nesting along an entire ecosystem like the Red River. That is what happened during 2007. For emphasis: Not a tern was able to nest because of extreme rain and high water events extending farther west even than Lake Texoma. What number of adult **Least Terns** returned this year

compared to previous years? I do not have sufficient data to compare for 2006, so for this comparison to be valid, I will have to compare 2008 to 2005. To be sure we are comparing apples to apples; I guarantee the total count covers 278 river miles each year from Alexandria LA to Index AR. Arkansas claims 93 miles and Louisiana has 185 miles.

In 2005 my **Least Tern** totals in Arkansas show 452  
In 2005 my **Least Tern** totals in Louisiana are 208  
The two state total for 278 river miles is 660

In 2008 my **Least Tern** totals in Arkansas show 232  
In 2008 my **Least Tern** totals in Louisiana are 229  
The two state totals for 278 river miles is 461

Analysis:

The full extent of the loss is 30 % of the population!  
We actually had more adult **Least Terns** in Louisiana in 2008 than in 2005. Why?

The reason is because high water last summer, winter and spring created a few new sandbars in the Pool stages and more birds attempted to raise families here. The upriver colonies were in the best condition I have ever seen for terns to nest.

Were they successful?

As shown in the previous article, they were not as successful as one would expect!.

The Louisiana colonies raised 70, with 10 more possible.  
The Arkansas colonies raised 91, with 48 more possible.

Implications:

Next year the newly created areas in the Pool stage will be vegetated almost entirely and fewer birds will attempt to nest in areas South of Shreveport unless some habitat management occurs.

Next year the improved habitat in the free-flowing portions of the river will still be especially acceptable to nesting least terns, and there will be a few more to take advantage of those improved conditions.

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### LEAST TERNS ON THE RED RIVER IN 2008

This report summarizes twelve trips on the Red River in both Arkansas and Louisiana from north of Texarkana to Alexandria during the summer of 2008. After the complete failure of any terns to nest in 2007 due to a hundred year rain event and high water event all summer

long, the year 2008 gave the birds a chance to rebound. This year was a good year for the terns. 229 adult **Least Terns** returned to Louisiana and raised 70 birds to fledglings, with a potential for 9 more from eggs and chicks. In Arkansas 232 adult birds returned and raised 91 to fledglings with 8 unfledged chicks, 20 nests, and 40 eggs yet to be added to that number. Arkansas is doing much better than Louisiana with almost the identical number of adults present.

The high water of last summer abated temporarily during the fall, and resumed during February to May, lowering in mid-May enough to allow the terns to find ideal sandy islands, clean of nearly all vegetation over all of the free-flowing range of the river North of Shreveport. A different situation existed in the five pool stages of the river from Shreveport South where a few islands emerged above pool level, showed enough low-level sandy characteristics to encourage the birds to attempt to nest and then grassed over rapidly, causing nesting failure in most places. The worst example was in Shaw Lake Area of Pool 5, just north of Bishop's Point where on the initial survey in June, 50 Least Terns were attempting to nest. This number decreased, as birds gave up on the deteriorating circumstances and sought suitable habitat upriver. Finally 14 adult birds were able to hatch 4 eggs and raise those four chicks to fledglings. I estimate that less than half of the original 50 left in time to successfully nest at other locations, judging by increased numbers in the successful colonies of Benton (a brand new location), Glycerine (where the threat of a gravel mine exists) and Hosston (visible from the LA 2 Bridge).

New potential enemies of **Least Terns** have made their presence known. On a canoe trip with Jack Land in 2006 we saw a cougar on the river in Arkansas, at a sweep of river formerly known as Panther Bend. Will a cougar bother a **Least Tern** if he can't catch a beaver? On an Island evaluation trip at the end of October, 2007 with Rob Wiley, a wildlife contractor from Ohio, we found bear tracks crossing Clipper Revetment sandbar in Arkansas. Will a bear stop to tear up a **Least Tern** colony if he can't find a bee tree? .

In Louisiana at Scott's Slough on the Red River on July 8, 2008 I watched as a week old tern chick ran across the hot sand. Through binoculars I watched as a **Scissor-tailed Flycatcher** left its mid-island perch on a solitary snag, and attacked the fuzzy chick, hitting it while in flight, sending it tumbling. In a split second the adult **Least Tern** attacked from above and sent the Scissor-tailed flycatcher hastening away, minus a few feathers,

and looking for a safer meal. This incident suggests to me the near certainty that this bird had learned to make a meal of very young **Least Terns**. There were certainly no other potential food items on the barren island for the predatory flycatcher to consider eating. So as beautiful as **Scissor-tailed Flycatchers** are to behold, I have lost some of my admiration for them.

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### The Annual 2008 Yellow Rail Drag, Red Slough Wildlife Management Area, Oklahoma

High on most birder's to find list is the cryptic Yellow Rail. Even though these beautiful rails are large enough to see, they are rarely seen because they blend perfectly with their backgrounds and rarely flush. Yellow Rails are more often heard than seen and have a very distinctive Morse code sounding call. I have heard individual birds in Louisiana and North Dakota but never seen one.

The Red Slough Wildlife Management Area is located just north of the Red River off US 259 about 18 miles south of Idabel in southeastern Oklahoma. For some years now, I have wanted to make a trip to the site to see how this large area of impoundments is managed for waterbird but never had the time to go. I was particularly interested in the widely reported annual early October Yellow Rail Drags conducted by David Arbour. Well, this year, high gas prices be danged, I decided to go and had a wonderful, productive birding visit to the area.

Red Slough WMA is situated about 2 ½ hours from Shreveport with the best route being I-12 to Longview, Texas and US 259 north to the Idabel, Oklahoma area. Immediately north of the Texas-Oklahoma border, OK Route 87 intersects US 259. Go east about 3 miles and intersect Mudline Road on the left at a Getty Oil sign. Go north on Mudline Road and in less than a mile, you are on the WMA. There are three parking pull outs equally spaced from the south border to the north border of the WMA. A dozen avid birders met David Arbour at the middle turn out about 9 AM on a beautiful, cloudless, calm Sunday morning.

After a quick search for a King Rail that had been seen nearby, we motored to the western area of the WMA to Paschal Lane and met Berlin Heck who was waiting with a "rail drag". The rail drag was a stout rope with cola bottles filled with gravel attached every three feet. David explained that we would pull the drag back and forth in the adjacent field to flush rails. Several of us

followed about five feet behind the drag to make sure that rails not flushed by the drag would not elude us. The dry grass was about knee high. David advised us to be especially attentive to areas with a yellow colored grass. On the second pass, a **Yellow Rail** popped up. It immediately dived ahead of us about 15 feet in front of the drag. We surrounded the area and converged carefully shuffling our feet to keep from hurting the bird. Sure enough, the bird was very nearly stepped on before it popped up again. It was invisible even though the cover was quite open. Talk about a great look as it posed quite still. Then it flushed and flew providing even better looks. We found it again before it flew some distance away.

We managed a total of three different **Yellow Rails** before we called it quits to visit the various impoundments to search for shorebirds, waders, waterfowl and whatever else could be found. We constantly flushed **Leconte's Sparrows** in the field and often saw **Sedge Wrens**. Near a brushy area a Vesper Sparrow posed for us.

Once we left the rail field, we visited various WMA impoundments and picked up some really interesting birds for the site including **American Avocet**, **Bald Eagle**, **Canvasback**, **Virginia Rail**, and **Nelson's Sharp-tailed Sparrow**. I found it a bit humorous, coming from south-central Louisiana to participate in a very serious search for an alligator! We did not find anyigators but did pass a nest site which was the first documented, successful alligator nest in Oklahoma.

I had visited some of the reservoirs at the north end of the WMA prior to the assembly time for the rail drag. The WMA is closed to visitors other than organized hunts from mid-October to the end of January but we were able to visit the area thanks to David's scheduled rail drag event. I found a number of waterfowl and song birds in the nearby riparian area during that early morning search. Birds very rare to the area included a single Neotropic Cormorant and a flock of 15 Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks that included 4 adults and 11 young birds.

I am a gung ho "lister" and my overnight trip to Oklahoma allowed me to generate an Oklahoma State List and add two year birds to my 2008 list – **Yellow Rail** and **Nelson's Sharp-tailed Sparrow**. My list for my Red Slough WMA trip follows. Others in the group recorded the following birds that I missed: **Northern Pintail**, **Roseate Spoonbill**, **Sora**, and **Common Moorhen**.

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### **The Working Wetlands Conservation Initiative**

#### **Background:**

Working agricultural lands in the southern United States and California, primarily rice and/or crawfish farming, contribute significantly to the habitat requirements of migrating waterfowl and other wetland-dependent wildlife. For example, of the estimated six million birds wintering in Southern Louisiana, 75 percent of the habitat is provided on the crop producing land along the Gulf Coast. The remaining 25 percent is supplied by the marsh habitats along the Gulf. Similarly, agricultural production in the Central Valley of California is critical to wintering bird populations.

Millions of other waterbirds including waders, shorebirds, gulls, terns, rails, moorhens, gallinules, coots, gulls and terns benefit from working wetland habitat. The working wetlands in southern Louisiana and southeastern Texas are invaluable habitat as the result of the integration of crawfish within the rice landscape. This ensures that moist soil and shallow water habitat is available throughout the year to support resident, breeding, wintering and migrant birds.

Rice acreage in the region exceeds 800,000 acres and crawfish acreage approaches 200,000 acres. Rice is cultivated in the warm months from spring into fall. Crawfish is cultivated from fall into spring. The two

crops compliment each other. Although little crawfish is cultivated in California, feral populations of the same species cultivated in Louisiana and Texas, the red swamp crawfish, are present throughout the state's rice production areas and provide significant macro-invertebrate food resources for predaceous waterbirds. There is a direct correlation between geometric increases in wading bird populations – egrets, herons, night-herons, ibises, and spoonbills – in Louisiana and the development of the state's crawfish industry over the past half century.

Current trends in agriculture are positive for the production of crops along the Gulf and in California. However, these very factors place habitat quantity and quality for waterfowl and other wetland-dependent wildlife at risk by replacing beneficial crop systems with crop systems that leave no residual habitat, or maintain the moist-soil conditions necessary for production of beneficial plant materials, invertebrates, small fish, crawfish and related habitats. The decline in available habitat on agricultural producing land will concentrate the birds on fewer acres resulting in degraded habitat quality, increased risk of avian disease outbreaks and population decline.

Of special concern is the loss of coastal and interior wetlands in southern Louisiana. Since 1950, over 1.5 million acres of coastal wetlands have been lost along the Louisiana coast. Waterbirds have responded favorably to the working wetlands immediately adjacent to this coast as has been documented by a number of studies.

Similar to the Grassland Reserve Program's annual payment for a "broader" natural resource benefiting management on working grasslands, a payment for working wetland management on cropland will enhance the habitat essential to sustaining waterfowl and other wetland-dependent wildlife. The historic contribution of agricultural production areas for meeting waterfowl and other wetland-dependent wildlife habitat needs, as wetland conversion reduced the native habitat, is well documented. Public participation in a "working lands concept" will extend the beneficial use of these lands to the greater benefit of society in providing habitat requirements without restricting much needed agricultural production.

#### **Recommendation:**

The Natural Resources Conservation Service will establish under the authorities of the Wildlife Habitat

Incentives Program (WHIP) and the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) a “working wetlands” pilot program for working agricultural lands providing waterfowl and other wetland-dependent wildlife habitat through water management practices. Key components of the pilot program effort will be:

1. The program will be offered in rice and/or crawfish production areas of Southern Louisiana, Texas and California;
2. Annual per acre cost-share and/or incentive payments will be available for up to 5 years for program participants completing working wetland-management practices;
3. The payment will be for wetland-management practices that provide benefits to waterfowl and other wetland-dependent wildlife;
4. Payments will be offered for three different payment levels as related to the length/period of habitat availability and quality of management (forage/diet and water);
5. Payment ranges will be established in the range of \$25 to \$50/acre/year as established by the state conservationist in consultation with the State Technical Committee. The rates will be based on actual costs of the practices in the respective states.

**Note:**

The Working Wetlands Habitat Initiative was submitted to the U. S. Department of Agriculture in August 2008. No final action has been taken as of this writing (October 2008). Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.
