MARCH

BIRDING AT BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE

Saturday, March 28; 7:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.

This will be the BSG's first field trip to Barksdale in nearly ten years! Come bird the 22,000 acre East Reservation, a protected area with very limited human intrusion. This huge tract features miles of uninterrupted hardwood forest, some mature pine stands, half a dozen lakes, several ponds, bayous, and open fields. This is a local trip that you really don't need to miss.

Meet in the parking lot of Barksdale Federal Credit Union on North Gate Road at 7:00 a.m. You will need a valid I.D., preferably a Louisiana Driver's License. Binoculars, scopes, and cameras have all been cleared with base security. Be sure to bring a sack lunch for a picnic at Clear Lake Park. There are restroom facilities at the park.

John Dillon will distribute a sign-up sheet at the March meeting for those who plan to go. If you are unable to attend the March meeting but would like to go on the trip, please email John directly. Names of all participants must be submitted to base security at least 5 days prior to the trip.

The Friday and Saturday night meetings will be held at the Grand Isle Community Center. The Friday night program is "The Albatross: International Conservation Challenge" presented by Robert Doughty. Refreshments will be served. The Saturday night program is "The Louisiana Coast: Worth Seeing, Worth Saving, Worth Celebrating" by Gay Gomez. The presentation will feature highlights from Gay's recently-published book, *The Louisiana Coast: Guide to an American Wetland*. The Saturday night banquet will be catered by the ladies of Grand Isle. Meeting cost is \$10 per person and the banquet is \$20 per person.

Membership in LOS is not required to participate in any of the LOS meetings, but you are encouraged to join to support the activities of our state society. Annual dues are \$20 for a regular membership and \$25 for a family membership. LOS is for birders of all levels, amateur or professional. Three meetings are held each year with programs on Friday and Saturday nights, organized field trips on Saturday and, for the winter meeting, also on Sunday, and a banquet on Saturday night. The spring meeting is usually held the last weekend in April; the fall meeting is the last weekend in October; and the winter meeting is held in different locations around the state, usually the last weekend in January. THE OWL POEM

Explanatory note: On Friday, February 13th, 2009, John Dillon was owling at Lake Claiborne State Park. What he discovered there prompted him to call upon four additional birders: Linda Adrion, Terry Davis, Mary Ellen Lewis, and Charlie Lyon. On the night of the 14th, the birders recorded what they initially believed to be credible evidence of a Northern Saw-whet Owl in North Louisiana. What follows is a verse narrative of the events of that night. As of yet, these events remain unexplained and will likely go the way of similar great American folklore, such as bigfoot, the Salem witches and little green men.

Late upon an evening owling did a handsome lad go prowling
For to call unto him predatory birds of mystery.
Not the least did he there shudder, for the owls he hoped to flutter

Down to him where he could mutter
To them weird and wondrous vespers while the pines were whispering,
In the dark and inky shadows where the pines were whispering.

The lad he started gently calling as the temperature was falling,
And the noisy chorus frogs were singing out their hearts' lament.
Like a screech-owl he was trilling, every second of it thrilling,
And his soul he thus was spilling
Out to owls, the feathered watchmen of that night's occult event,
The silent, lurking, feathered watchmen of that night's occult event.

He sat patiently in darkness, listening to the eerie starkness
Of the silence that would fall between his little haunting hoots.
There was no reply of screech-owl, so the lad, in search of new fowl,
Started calling then for Barred Owl,
Brawny, deadly, silent bird of prey who calls, "Who cooks for you?"
Bird of prey of swamps and bogs who loudly calls, "Who cooks for you?"

All expectant thus of hooting, he then heard a sort of fluting,
Haunting call that echoed through the foggy, starless, moonless night.
Keenly listening to the haunting little call it seemed a flaunting
Little owl unmoved by daunting
Calls of bigger, meaner owls from out the darkness of the night.
Still the little owl kept calling in the darkness of the night.

The lad, a birder true and practiced, uttered forth at first the crack guess Of a Northern Saw-whet Owl upon the premises that night.

He knew a birder must be thorough, and his brows began to furrow From the gentle toned "wooWEEoo"

That the little owl repeated, but the call, it seemed just right.

Though confused, the birder knew the call, it really seemed just right.

Anxious, careful and determined, he went home and called two more men And two ladies, too, to help locate the Northern Saw-whet Owl.

On the next night they descended on the place by pines defended,

These five who so depended

On the little bird to show, and not to be a secret fowl.

Just give us a "wooWEEoo" and don't be a secret fowl.

For an hour nothing stirred except a boisterous, bigger bird; Just a plain old local Barred Owl gave a loud "Who cooks for you?" The birders all were worried that the Saw-whet they had hurried To quite possibly had scurried Off to some more distant place and wouldn't answer, "WooWEEoo." Such disappointment if the Saw-whet wouldn't answer, "WooWEEoo."

Then, at last the bird called out amid the darkness thereabout.

Vindication for the lad was finally all but sealed away.

Then they started to record the calling of the little bird,

So no one could doubt their word

About the Northern Saw-whet owl; "If we could get it all on tape,"

They said, "No one could ever scoff if we could get it all on tape."

Now, they'd called the little bird in, being absolutely certain
That a Northern Saw-whet Owl had been exactly what they'd heard.
The birders got their voice recordings, but the little owl affording
Them no visual reporting,
One of them suggested now that they should video the bird.

Said a startling, cautious word, "I think that it's a bigger bird,"
But the lad just knew what they had heard
Was a Northern Saw-whet Owl, a little wily, woodsy elf
And the video would show the wondrous, wily, woodsy elf.

With the spotlight he did search and then he found the bird's high perch, "I think I've got it!" he exclaimed, and the others took a peek.

Then they stood there stupefied, and could scarce believe their eyes,

"It's a Barred Owl!" one then cried.

And the lad could only stare and say "You're freeking kidding me!

And the lad could only stare and say, "You're freaking kidding me!" After all this it's a Barred Owl? Man, you're freaking kidding me!"

The lad just couldn't let it end; he said, "Play the call again. And if the Barred Owl says 'wooWEEoo,' then we'll know that we've been wrong.' They played the call once more and waited, and each birder's breath was bated.

And what they'd not anticipated Was a Barred Owl that could somehow sing a Northern Saw-whet's song. The Barred Owl said, "wooWEEoo" like a Northern Saw-whet's song.

So, all you birders then take heed here at the brave, heroic deeds Of these five friends whose message thus is really anything but moot. If you're in the woods a walking, and you hear an owl a talking,

He may really just be mocking You and, even though, you think he likes you, doesn't give a hoot. You'd think an owl might care about you, but he doesn't give a hoot.

BIRD REPORT – compiled March 3, 2009

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.


