## FIELD TRIPS

**October 4 - Saturday - Hervey Farm Hawk Count.** This event has been held ever since I discovered the joys of hawk counting. The farm has always produced hawks. Last year, we counted over 200 hawks, including an **Osprey**. Come early and enjoy birding on the farm, if you'd like. Hawk count hours are usually from about 10 a.m. until 3 p.m. Bring food, drinks, and a folding chair. Location: Hervey Dairy Farm. Directions from Stonewall: At the JCT of US 171 and Flournoy-Lucas Rd. go 1.5 mi. E on Flournoy-Lucas Rd. to Missile Base Rd., turn left and go 2.3 mi. to Hervey Dairy Farm Rd. on right. Directions from Shreveport: Go south on Linwood Ave. 5.0 mi. from junction with Flournoy-Lucas Rd., turn right on Ranchette Rd. go 1.0 mi. turn left (Ranchette Rd. ends), go 0.8 mi. to Hervey Dairy Farm Road on left. Leader: Hubert Hervey.

**October 11 - Saturday - Caddo Detention Center.** This half day trip is our second time to bird CDC. The first trip produced good grassland and woodland species. CDC is a good natural area, medium walking is required. Meet at LSUS parking lot at 7:00 a.m. Leader: Larry Raymond.

**October 18 - Saturday - Millwood Lake, Arkansas.** We have heard of the great birding at Millwood Lake for years, and now is our chance to experience it. Our leader is Mr. Millwood Lake himself, (a.k.a. Charles Mills). We will leave from the WhatABurger on North Market St., promptly at 6:00 a.m. Two hours later, we meet Charles Mills at the Beard's Bluff Overlook on the dam of Millwood Lake. A back-up date is in place for Nov. 22nd in case high winds are forecast for this date. This is our second trip here as a club. Leader: Hubert Hervey.

**October 24, 25, 26 - Annual LOS Fall meeting.** This is the 50th anniversary of the LOS and big plans for the celebration are underway. Local BSG members will be

honored. Fall birding in Cameron is always great. Some of our members attend regularly and will be glad to lead our newer members to the best birding areas, which are many. **Special note:** The dormitory building at Rockefeller National Wildlife Preserve has been reserved. Many people who attended the BSG trip there in 1991, still remember what a great trip that was. Members intending on going on this trip must sign up ahead of time (see article below).

**November 1 - Walter B. Jacob's Nature Park and Richard Fleming Park on Cross Lake.** Woodland birds at the Nature Park, led by the Caddo Parish Parks and Recreation Director, Larry Raymond. Fleming Park can produce migrants and waterbirds. Moderate walking, half day, meet at WhatABurger on North Market St. at 7:00 a.m. Leader: Larry Raymond.

**November 8 - C.B. Dickson Park in Shreveport.** Wintering woodland birds along the Red River can be expected. See our **Mute Swan** and **Canada Goose** families, but don't count them or turn them in because.....oh well.....? Ask Will!! sigh :-). Meet at LSUS parking lot near the Museum of Life Sciences at 7:30 a.m. Leader: Jim Ingold.

**November 15 - Cross Lake Barge Trip.** Always a favorite trip, I have two trips scheduled this year (Dec. 13th also). A per person fee of \$10 approximately, will cover the cost of barge rental. Second official records were accepted for **Cave Swallow** and **Lazuli Bunting** and third records were accepted for **Pacific-slope Flycatcher** and **Sulphur-**

**bellied Flycatcher.** A second or a possible a third record for **White-tailed Hawk** was also accepted.

The **Pomarine Jaeger** was officially removed from the Review List.

## I-49 BORROW PITS

**T**his trip produced an excellent study of different sized sandpipers. I think we learned how to identify **Stilt Sandpipers** under poor light conditions and compare them with dowitchers. **Pectoral Sandpipers, Least Sandpipers,** and **Western Sandpipers** were also seen. We saw large numbers of **Blue-winged Teal,** three **Northern Shoveler** and one female **Northern Pintail.** September 6 is the earliest date on record for pintail. There were lots of **Black-necked Stilts** present, but the **American Avocets** were not found, I saw them both before and after this date. I just couldn't produce any for the club members to see. A **Wilson's Phalarope** flew around us for quite a while. We needed the experience of identifying this bird in flight more than we needed to see one spinning around in circles on the water anyway.

We went on to Mibermel Farms, the only rice growing location I know of in northwestern Louisiana. The date must have been a few days too early because we couldn't scare up any rails. I have been back and saw one **Sora.** John Danby, the manager, will probably be through combining the rice before this article is printed. This farm is located about two miles south of Powhatan, on LA 1.

I canceled the Fish Hatchery portion of the trip because all the ponds were full and no draw downs were scheduled until October and November. That is when the birding gets to be fun, with peeps and other shorebirds, feeding on the exposed mudflats at the bottom of the drained ponds.

## A LITTLE BLUE HERON NAMED LOUEY

**I**n the first place I want you to understand that this little blue is not blue in color, only in species name. That means it is a very young bird. It will be blue by this time next year. I named it Louey because Louis Armstrong played a little blues himself, along with a lot of jazz. Louey has been here on the big pond for a couple of weeks, and is trying to learn what **Little Blue Herons** do for a living. Most of the **Cattle Egret** have gone farther south by late September, so Louey doesn't have their example to follow.

The **Great Egret** and **Great Blue Heron** both chase Louey away from their fishing place. He can't imitate the **Belted Kingfisher** and dive into the water, so Louey has to learn from his mistakes.

Have you ever positioned yourself exactly under the eating end of a heron or egret? I recently saw a picture taken from this angle and both eyes were zeroed in on the camera. Everything under the fishing bird is visible to both eyes, so distance is measured precisely. I have watched **Cattle Egrets** picking horse flies off a cow's back. The aim is so precise that the cow never even twitches her tail.

Louey was wading up to his skinny drumsticks, searching for food in the clear water of the pond. First, he would peer straight down around his legs to see what he had stirred up. Then he would crane his neck to one side as he zeroed in on the school of minnows. Old folks called **Little Blue Herons**, like Louey, "White Cranes." I wonder if the way they crane their necks is why old timers called them cranes, or because they thought the bird resembled a crane (either the bird or the machine). I watched through the scope as Louey made two successful minnow ambushes. I thought to myself, "This is like a novice eating crawfish tails. Louey could starve to death with a plate full of food." You know how small minnows are!

Then Louey made a stab and came up with a larger meal. It was a tadpole bullfrog, or bullfrog tadpole, if you prefer. The reason I say this is because it had both a tail and legs. A juicy meal indeed, I thought. No man would ever starve to death eating frog legs. Louey walked over to shallow water and adjusted the "frogpole" to better send it on its downward course, when instead of swallowing it, he opened his bill and "spit" out the "polefrog." Next, he washed his bill out. He opened his bill and swished it back and forth, over and over in the pond water. Four times he did this. Then he settled down to fishing. Once he stabbed at a fish with his bill agape, which he never closed. I think he purposefully missed a tadpole, as soon as he realized what it was.

Later, Louey caught a long-eared sunfish and downed it posthaste. It must have tasted good. We all need to have the bad taste of failure washed out of our mouth by success, even if our name is Louey. Louey come blow your jazzy horn!
