FIELD TRIPS

January 4, 1998 - Bossier, Caddo, Bienville Christmas Bird Count. Now you know what BCBCBC stands for. This is a popular and productive CBC that has accurately provided data showing the changes in bird species and numbers due to the completion of the Red River Waterway Project. We invite your participation. Coordinator: Paul Dickson.

January 10 - Cross Lake, Mallard Bay and north shore. Ducks, cormorants, grebes, and very good sparrow habitat. Meet at the What-A-Burger on N. Market St. at 7:30 a.m. Leader: Mac Hardy.

January 17 - Owl Prowl. The Yearwood Road area has consistently produced our best record of owls. This popular trip is back by popular demand. I promise not to keep you up past your bedtime. Depart from LSU-S parking lot at 3:00 p.m. We will bird Yearwood Road until dark and start trying for owls after that. **Short-eared Owls** are usual for this trip along with our 4 resident species. Meet us in progress down Yearwood Road if you can't make the 3:00 p.m. time. Leader: Hubert Hervey.

January 30-31- LOS Annual Winter meeting. Baton Rouge.

February 7 - Sandhill Crane trip. The Wemple Farm near Cheneyville hosts a flock of cranes each year, numbering several hundred. The cranes have now spread out onto the surrounding area. Geese, ducks, **White Ibis**

and shorebirds are usually found. Many other birds are seen on this trip and rarities are not really rare. Carpool from the LSU-S parking lot. The trip leaves at 6:30 a.m. Leader: Hubert Hervey

February 14 - Paul Dickson Deer Farm on Leonard Road. This is primarily a bird banding day. Jim Ingold will band many species of birds, maybe even a **Harris' Sparrow**. **Ross' Goose** and **Bald Eagle** were present last year, and no telling what special birds will show up this year. Meet at the farm at 7:00 a.m. Leaders: Jim Ingold and Paul Dickson.

February 21 - Red River Agricultural Experiment Station. This trip is scheduled earlier in the year this time, in hopes of finding longspur species. Last year produced courting **Horned Larks** and an **American Bittern**. Leave from LSU-S parking lot at 7:00a.m. Leader: Bill Wood

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

K eith Kimmerle is originally from Indiana and has a BS in Aerospace Technology from Indiana State University. He is a former Air Force Pilot (12 yr.), of which 18 months were spent at Barksdale Air Force Base (B-52s). Three years as a squadron level Safety Officer investigating birdstrikes led him to a career in ornithology. He recently completed master's course work at Central Missouri State, and is currently enrolled as a doctoral student in the Department of Biological Sciences at Mississippi State University. Previous research experience has included Red-cockaded Woodpecker and coastal Least Tern. His primary research focus since 1992 has been with Purple Martins, studying natal dispersal and migration, having banded 2,000+ martins since 1993. His research on Purple Martins has taken him from Brownsville Texas to Key West Florida, and Arizona. He will be the keynote speaker at the Alabama Ornithological Society meeting in late January. He is also Secretary for the Inland Bird Banding Association. He will discuss any questions on Purple Martins and their management, after the program.

CROSS LAKE TRIP RESULTS 13 DECEMBER 1997

We finally managed to pick a day for the Cross Lake barge trip, that had weather good enough to let us enjoy finding some of the birds we had hoped to locate. Last year's trip was canceled because of high winds, and this year's first trip was canceled because of sleet and winds. Although it was cold on the 13th, I suspected we would find some really good birds. I did not expect to get a life bird. It has now been three years since I saw my last new bird, unless I decide to count a jaeger on Lake Millwood and a different jaeger on Lake O' the Pines back in October, but I really couldn't make out whether those were Long-tailed or Parasitic. To keep the suspense from building too much, I will go ahead and tell you right now that everyone on both the morning and the afternoon trips had excellent looks at an **Oldsquaw**. On the morning trip, we saw it in flight first, knew we had something very different, and then located it feeding near a concrete wall on the north shore. The **Oldsquaw** was very cooperative, letting us drift very near as it fed in the shallow water. This was my life bird.

Another surprise was seeing two **Common Mergansers** take off from in front of us and fly around the barge, disappearing low over the west end of Cross Lake. They quickly got up over the tree line, where their clean white belly, chest, and neck were clearly visible. After going around the barge they slowly flew lower and lower, until they were just above the water, and went out of sight. As always with ducks that I am trying hard to be certain of the correct identification, I spent nearly all of my attention on the drake, and while I am certain it was a pair of **Common Merganser's**, I really can't give a description for the hen. The amount of white in the wings was correct for both birds to be either **Red-breasted** or **Common Merganser's**, but the drake was all white, when seen from underneath, thus eliminating the Red-breasted of which I have seen hundreds. Also, they were larger than **Red-breasted Mergansers**.

Cross Lake was its usual scene of frantic feeding for thousands of cormorants and gulls. The **Double-crested Cormorants** feed on the fish of the lake and cripple many in the process. The **Ring-billed Gulls** and **Bonaparte's Gulls** wait around picking up what they can. This year we saw more **Horned Grebes** (18) than I can remember. We finally managed to pick out one **Eared Grebe**. It was a treat to see the grebes take flight and show the white in their secondaries.

Yes, we did get to see a **Bald Eagle**. It was perched on the only undeveloped area of the lake, Buzzard Island. The afternoon barge trip saw the **Bald Eagle** in flight. I am afraid the days of seeing several **Bald Eagles** on Cross Lake are over, since much of the land around the lake is developed. What a price we pay for progress! Let's save what we can, while we can.

NEXT OUTING

Our next outing is on January 10th, at Cross Lake, Mallard Bay and north side. Also this trip, we might consider going to the Catfish Ponds on Highway 71 because they are loaded. Last week, I saw 120 **Hooded Mergansers** and 30 **Redheads** there. Meet at the What-A-Burger on North Market Street at 7:30 a.m. Leader Mac Hardy.

OWL PROWL

January 17th, Yearwood Road. If **Short-eared Owls** are located somewhere else, I might change the location for this trip, so come to the January club meeting for any updates or call me at 925-9249 for the final decision. Depart from the LSUS parking lot near the museum at 3:00 p.m. Leader Hubert Hervey.

SANDHILL CRANE TRIP

February 7th. This trip has produced cranes every year. Many other unusual birds have also been seen in the Cheneyville to Echo area, including **Vermilion Flycatcher** and **Say's Phoebe**. We never know what specialty to expect. It is well worth your effort to make this trip. The earlier we leave, the more birds we will see. Leave from the LSUS parking lot at 6:30 a.m.. Leader: Hubert Hervey.

ATCHAFALAYA BASIN TRIP

March 21st. It is not too early for you to be making mental plans to go with us on Atchafalaya Basin Canoe trip on the weekend of March 21st. If you do not canoe, you would still enjoy walking around and learning about this priceless area of Louisiana swamps. The participants will have three choices of facilities; primitive camping, KOA style camping, or motel. These details will have to be worked out with the Ozark Society of Shreveport and Charles Fryling of Baton Rouge. If you can't make a planning session you need to contact Hubert Hervey at 925-9249.

NEW AREA BIRDS

Since the inception of the Bird Study Group in 1985-1986 we have seen a significant growth in the list of birds known in northwestern Louisiana. The most recent field check list includes 325 species that have been verified to have occurred in our area at some time. Eighteen species from that total have been discovered since the Bird Study Group began and most were a direct result of field trips of the BSG or of individual efforts of BSG members. The following list of species includes the earliest date and original observer, based on the best information available to me.

Red-throated Loon – 1 Feb. 1992; during LOS meeting in Shreveport.

Neotropic Cormorant – 16 Mar. 1996; Dorothy Metzler and Cameron Cox.

Fulvous Whistling-Duck – 5 May 1996; Jean and Jeff Trahan.

Ross' Goose – 1 Mar. 1989; near Shreveport (Imhof; American Birds 1989:492).

Surf Scoter – 28 Nov. 1992; BSG outing on Cross Lake.

Black-necked Stilt – 18 Mar. 1986; Paul Dickson in Bienville Parish.

Ringed Turtle-Dove – 27 May 1990, 17 June 1990; Gordon Blackman.

Monk Parakeet – 1989; specimen coming to feeder in Bossier City (Mac Hardy).

Broad-tailed Hummingbird – 26 Dec. 1996; Charlie Lyon in Shreveport

Alder Flycatcher – 23 Aug. 1997; Terry and Stella Davis

Say's Phoebe – 21 Jan. - 9 Feb. 1986; Paul Dickson in Red River Parish.

Ash-throated Flycatcher – 13 Jan. 1985; Muth (Amer. Birds 1985:177)

Northern Wheatear – 4 Oct. 1996; Hubert and Pat Hervey at Hubert's farm.

Cape May Warbler – 16 Sep., 1995; Jim Ingold.

Spotted Towhee – 4 Apr. 1996 (earliest record not known); Jim Ingold.

Clay-colored Sparrow – 14 Oct. 1995; Charlie Lyon and Susan Holbrook.

House Finch – 1 Jan. 1990; Helen Hood in Shreveport (many observers also on 31 Jan. 1990).

Lesser Goldfinch – 21 Dec. 1995; Bill Hall at home in Shreveport.

Several other species that have been rediscovered recently are often thought of as new discoveries; however, they are actually known from our area from records many years before. These species include: **Brown Pelican**, **White-winged Scoter**, **Red Knot**, **Band-tailed Pigeon**, **White-winged Dove**, **Black-throated Blue Warbler**, **Golden-crowned Sparrow**, **Black-headed Grosbeak**, and **Bullock's Oriole**.

What will be the next species found in our area? We can probably make a pretty accurate list of predictions. If you have some definite ideas based on factual information (current irregularities in migrations, irruptions, etc., no hunches please) let me know about them. Our group, armed with good information and a hit list, can probably make some more good discoveries.
