Entitled, "Watching Warblers: A Video Guide to the Warblers of Eastern North America," it has been getting rave reviews. The video shows all 39 wood warblers found in the eastern United States and for most, includes nests and young. All species are represented by close-ups of males and females and includes habitat and range information. Both Siskel and Ebert gave it two thumbs up ☺.

BANDING RESULTS

DICKSON DEER FARM

On Saturday, 28 February 1998, the Bird Study Group had their annual trek to Paul Dickson's deer farm for the banding of the birds. Seventy-four individuals of nine species were mist-netted and banded:

Of the **White-crowned Sparrows**, 30 of the 42 (71%) were juvenile birds and the rest were adults, or birds at least in their third year of life. No birds that had been banded in previous years were recaptured. Species seen but not banded included: **Cinnamon Teal**, **Eastern Bluebird**, and **Great Blue Heron** plus many other species, which can be found in the bird report at the end of this newsletter.

Special Note: Some of the outings I was scheduled to lead will need to have volunteers to take my place. I have a job that starts on the 15th of April that will allow very little free time. I need volunteers for the following outings:

- May 2- Barksdale Air Force Base Canoe Trail trip.
- May 23- A Survey of North LA Breeding Warblers.
- June 6- Kisatchie National Forest - Longleaf Pine Vista.
- June 20 - Barksdale Air Force Base Waterbird Rookery.
- June 27 - Clark's Island on the Red River.

If you feel you can lead any of these trips, please contact me ASAP at 925-9249, or some of these great trips will be in danger of being cancelled.

I think I will be able to lead the following trips:

- April 17, 18 and 19 - Atchafalaya Basin Canoe Trip
- May 9 - North American Migration Count.

April 4 - Soda Lake. Resident woodland species should be returning and late wintering birds should still be present along with some migrants. The habitat is woods and water, and some years, a wading bird rookery is in use here. Leave the N. Market St. WhatABurger at 7:00 a.m. Leader: Larry Raymond.

April 24, 25, 26 - LOS Annual Spring Meeting. This is the most popular of the LOS meetings with a usual count of over 200 species including many beautiful warblers. Unusual birds are always expected and Sunday is usually spent chasing down the best birds of Saturday that you missed seeing. You could go to Cameron Parish for 20 years of LOS meetings and still discover new areas to bird.

May 2 - Barksdale Air Force Base Canoe Trail Trip. Mark Norris Canoe Outfitters has agreed to furnish canoes again for this trip into the wild, flooded wetlands of BAFB where 'gators and deer abound. The trail passes through the center of the BAFB rookery where you will get as close to nesting egret, heron, **Anhinga** and **White Ibis**, as you desire. **Tricolored Heron** nested and raised 2 young here last year. Meet at the Shreve Island Shopping Center in front of the Video Store at 7:00 a.m. Expect the usual hassle getting into the base. All participants must have a picture ID. Drivers must have current license, registration and insurance, in order to enter the base. This is an easy half-day trip with a picnic at the end. Provide your own food and drink. Leader: TBA

May 9 - North American Migration Count. We have participated in this count since its start. New members are always welcome. See the article "Outings and Warblers" in the April Newsletter for more details. Feeder watchers are needed. Contact Hubert Hervey for area assignments. We cover all of Caddo Parish, and occasionally spill over into other neighboring parishes. Larry, can we please meet at your home for the count tally? Coordinator: Hubert Hervey.

May 16 - Bayou Dorcheat Natural Scenic Waterway. We look forward to returning to this beautiful stream, and hope for better weather for this trip. Mark Norris Canoe Outfitters has agreed to furnish the canoes. This trip takes a little over half a day, so provide your own food and drinks accordingly. Meet at Bayou Inn Catfish Restaurant in Dixie Inn at 7:30 a.m. Leader: Roy Henderson.

May 23 - A Survey of North LA Breeding Warblers. We will go to the woods where we hope the warblers are. Special effort will be made to locate **Hooded, Kentucky, Swainson's, and Worm-eating Warblers, and Louisiana Waterthrush.** The participants can choose what warblers they want us to locate and we will try to do so. This is an all day trip, carpooling is suggested. See the special article titled "Outings and Warblers" in the April Newsletter for full details. Leave from LSUS parking lot at 6:00 a.m. For the dedicated birder or those wanting to learn more about warblers. Leader: TBA.

June 6 - Kisatchie National Forest - Longleaf Pine Vista. We will try to locate the specialties of the area; **Red-cockaded Woodpecker** and **Bachman's Sparrow.** This is an all day trip, with picnic planned if we can find the picnic area. The scenery is delightful and the birding usually produces what we expect. Leader: TBA.

June 20 - BAFB Rookery. Drive in trip (sometimes we walk). Thousands of waterbirds and waders can be seen on the nest at the most raucous time. No walking to moderate walking, depending upon the powers that be. Bring drink and snacks for a half day. Leader: TBA.

June 27 - Clark's Island on the Red River. Meet at Clark's Marina, south of McDade, off US 71 in Bossier Parish at 7:30 a.m. Bring a boat or canoe if you have one. We will attempt to get all members out to the island whether or not you have water transport. That doesn't mean you will have to swim. We hope the **Least Terns** and **Black-necked Stilts** will be nesting again at this location, as they did so successfully last year. Leader: TBA. Paul Dickson, could you please help me out on this one?

OUTINGS AND WARBLERS

In keeping with the theme of this month's program, which is warblers, we have several outings on which you are likely to see these colorful birds. Our area has fourteen species of nesting warblers. Wouldn't it be something to find most of these in one day? That is the object of the "Warbler Day".

(1) Warbler Day - May 23, 1998. This is our club's first ever outing intended to showcase the warblers breeding in northwestern Louisiana. The possibility of seeing many of these fourteen warblers, should enhance the enjoyment of this daylong outing. **Northern Parula, Yellow-throated Warbler, Pine Warbler, Prairie Warbler, Black-and-White Warbler, American Redstart, Prothonotary Warbler, Worm-eating Warbler, Swainson's Warbler, Louisiana Waterthrush, Kentucky Warbler, Common Yellowthroat, Hooded Warbler, and Yellow-breasted Chat,** would be a colorful memory!

(2) North American Migration Count - May 10, 1998. I am always surprised by how many warblers are turned in on the NAMC day of counting birds. We counted 139 species of birds in 1997, an increase of twelve over 1996. Is it too much to expect around 140 species this year? All the regular participants have located favorite areas, and look forward to this big day. In fact, I think we could replace the defunct official "big day" with the new title "NAMC Big Day", because I think more species are counted on this outing than on any other. In order for you to participate, contact me at 925-9249 and I will assign an area to you or put you in touch with an existing group.

(3) All other outings. Of course, we see warblers on every outing we take. The spring dates are more productive for migrating warblers than the fall dates. And the warblers are easier to identify too. Our best warbler locations include C. Bickham-Dickson Park, Walter B. Jacobs Nature Park, Soda Lake, and the woodlands along the Red River (boat launch area). I am looking for a vacant day to squeeze in this last location for an outing. But nonetheless, warblers are where you find them. Profound, I know! Where might the best warbler locations be?

Two of my favorite warbler habitats are pecan orchards (especially when in bloom with catkins dangling), and the woodlands that border many of our area lakes and streams. The insects, produced by the water areas, and the insects attracted to blooming trees such as black willow, seem to act like warbler magnets. The successful over-wintering of the **Cape May Warbler** on Cross Lake illustrates this point. Area lakes, particularly, Wallace Lake, the north end of Toledo Bend, Bodcau Bayou, Caddo Lake and Lake Bistineau, all have good warbler habitat. So get out

and have a good time warbling? Warblering? Yellow bird watching!
