SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER OUTINGS

The following response from Charles Mills is full of excellent information pertaining to an article by Hubert Hervey in an earlier edition of this newsletter (Vol. 12, #6).

A REPLY TO "BIRDS TO EXPECT"

by Charles Mills

I had wanted to pass on that I thought that many of the species you included in the article were excellent choices. The only omission of any note I noticed was **Sabine's Gull** which, besides the 14-15 records from Millwood Lake, has also been recorded 2-3 times in northeast Texas. This bird will certainly show up and most likely between mid-September and mid-October.

I also had some comments about some of the other species:

1. **Black Scoter**: I have 3 records at Millwood-all between mid and late November. This is the hardest scoter for me to find. Much the same is true elsewhere in Arkansas.

2. **Red-necked and Red Phalarope**: Either of these are just as likely to be found in the middle of Cross Lake or the Red River as they are on a mudflat with other shorebirds. Most of the records I have for either species are from the middle of Millwood rather along the shore. Also, whether or not this would hold true for your locale, I have more records for **Red Phalarope** than **Red-necked Phalarope**. They can be trusting souls and can be closely approached if you happen to be birding from a boat.

3. **Jaegers**: Parasitic would, as you suggested, be the most likely to appear first. I have 6-7 records for Parasitic versus 3 for Long-tailed and 1 for Pomarine. Adults are less likely than immatures but have all appeared at Millwood at least once. Also, other than the first 2-3 birds, the more recent Parasitic's have appeared in mid-to-late November with at least a couple of occurrences extending into mid-December. The Long-tailed's have tended to appear in late September till mid-October. The

one Pomarine was a late August through early October record.

4. **McCown's Longspur:** There are 2 mid-to-late October records for Millwood so I think a Fall occurrence in NW LA would be just as likely. This species, along with Chestnut-collared, begin their Fall movements earlier than either Lapland or Smith's which nest further to the north.

A **White-winged Dove** showed up on the Texas-side of Texarkana earlier this month, (May ed.) and most recently, I photographed a probable **Lazuli X Indigo Bunting** hybrid just east of Texarkana, AR a little over a week ago. Last week, another observer had a flock of 300+ **Yellow-headed Blackbirds** in western Little River County. Also present at the same site were a couple of **Inca Doves** and **Eurasian Collared-Doves**.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Treasurer: Betty Mason reported that the club now has two bank accounts: one at Hibernia and a new account at City Bank. The club is changing its account to City Bank because of lower fees. It was last reported that we had \$199.37 at Hibernia. Since that time the club has incurred expenses of \$160.82 and received income of \$137.00 leaving a balance at Hibernia of \$175.55. A deposit of \$150.00 was used to open the account at City Bank. The club deposited income of \$85.00 at City Bank and had expenses (new checks for this account) of \$50.09 leaving a balance of \$182.91. The club also has \$176.05 on account at LSU and \$81.75 at the post office.

Because the club had been low on cash, the treasurer had been asked to prepare a budget for the last two years.
