MARCH THROUGH JUNE

A CALIFORNIA BIRD QUIZ

Who better to author a quiz on birds from a particular state, than someone who has never been there? But I enjoy reading about places that I might someday be able to visit. I hope you enjoy quizzing yourself and maybe learning something new in the process. The answers are printed elsewhere in this newsletter.

1. Mono Lake is a favorite spot for birds and birders. Many birds feed there. It is far too high in salt and alkalis for fish to live in it. What are the birds eating?
2. Some birds have the ability to live through periods of cold weather by reducing their body metabolism, temperature, and other functions until warmer weather returns. What are some of the species known to go into a state of torpor, or partially hibernate?
3. What bird is known to feed its chicks lizards so large that the lizard's hind legs and tail sometimes protrude from the young bird's bill until the head is digested?
4. Here in the south we know that the **Barred Owl** calls, "Who cooks for you." What California bird is said to say the same words?
5. What bird warms by basking in the early morning sun with feathers fluffed to expose its black skin?
6. What bird was called "el carpintero" by early Spanish Californians for its habit of drilling many small holes in trees?
7. What bird was formerly called the **Arkansas Kingbird**?
8. What bird species is the only member of a bird family that contains a single species? Hint: Chamaeidae---HUH? OK! (Hint two: tiny, doubly tiny).

A BIRD A DAY KEEPS THE DOCTOR AWAY!

GRAND ISLE MIGRATORY BIRD DAY

The Orleans Audubon Society will host the second annual migratory bird celebration day in Grand Isle, Louisiana, on Saturday, April 10, 1999. Birders, Grand Isle residents, and other interested persons are invited to this celebration of recent efforts to protect habitat for migratory birds. This year, as part of the sanctuary's effort, The Nature Conservancy of Louisiana has acquired (donated in December 1998) its first tract on Grand Isle, to be named Lafitte Woods Preserve. The day will begin on Fourchon Rd. at 8:30 a.m. with a birding tour led by the Crescent Bird Club. At noon, birders, local residents, and local officials will gather at Landry House Bed & Breakfast for lunch (Cost: \$10.00. Profits go to the Sanctuary Fund). Representatives of Orleans Audubon Society and the Nature Conservancy of Louisiana will give updates on the progress of this year's effort. Local Grand Isle residents who have welcomed birders to their backyards will be honored. After lunch a visit to the Lafitte Woods Preserve is planned.

Birdwatching is *the fastest growing single outdoor activity in America*. Birders are good for local economies by purchasing food and drinks, optics, gas, overnight accommodations, maps, sunscreen, bug spray, film, and ice. It is hoped that this effort will promote local businesses.

Live oaks on Grand Isle are recognized nationally as premier areas to view neo-tropical migratory birds. These woods give food and shelter to songbirds before and after their long journey across the Gulf of Mexico. The sanctuary is working with local landowners to insure long-term protection of these woodlands and provide green space for Grand Isle residents.

Bird Report Time

The spring migration is the time when we need your bird reports. Go birding and keep those reports coming. We are seeing new early dates already; for example, a **Warbling Vireo** and **Broad-winged Hawk**

(see Bird Report in this Newsletter) and **Prothonotary Warbler** (so new it will be in next month's Newsletter!).

One more birder picked up a disk packet for entering bird records for the BSG database. I have several packets ready, complete with a page of instructions and everything you need to enter bird records (except the computer -- supply that yourself).

We will soon have the bird report form on the BSG web site only for printing. In case you have run out of bird report forms you can print the bird report page to get a blank form. This is not a substitute for an interactive system we expect in the future. Remember to give complete localities, dates, and numbers for your records. Keep up the good reporting!

LOS SPRING MEETING

The spring meeting of the Louisiana Ornithological Society is scheduled for the weekend of April 24-26, 1999. The meeting will be held as usual in Cameron, Cameron Parish. In the past, members of the Bird Study Group have stayed at the Rockefeller Refuge. This facility will not be available to us this year, so any one planning on attending the LOS needs to make reservations at a motel.

APRIL BOARD MEETING

A meeting of the Board of Directors is scheduled for Thursday April 8, 1999. ANSWERS TO A CALIFORNIA BIRD QUIZ

1. Mono is an Indian word that means flies. Brine flies and brine shrimp abound in Mono Lake in incredible numbers; 4,000 brine flies per square foot and 55,000 brine shrimp per cubic yard.
2. **Poor-will** is the best known example of birds that are capable of slowing down their metabolism, along with hummingbirds, some of the swifts, and roadrunners. **Red-tailed Hawks** have been known to slow down enough to live for two to three weeks in captivity without food or water.
3. **Greater Roadrunner**

4. **White-winged Doves** also coo, "Who cooks for you," but I bet they can't answer with, "Who cooks for y'all."
5. Roadrunners adopt the heterothermic habits of their major prey base, reptiles. In winter they may eat smaller birds.
6. A colony of **Acorn Woodpeckers** has been known to drill over 20,000 holes in a single sycamore tree, and place an acorn in each hole.
7. **Western Kingbird**
8. The **Wrentit** is the only member of its unique family.

This quiz was suggested by reading two books I borrowed from Jim Ingold. They are; *Birders Guide to Northern California* by LoLo and Jim Westrich, and *Birds of California's Deep Canyon* by Wesley W. Weathers.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
March 9, 1999, 7:00 p.m.
Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Kathryn Trahan presented the program "Camp Chiricahua" that described her experiences and the birds she saw in southeast Arizona last summer. Her expenses at the camp were supported by the Baton Rouge Audubon Society and the Louisiana Ornithological Society, and of course, her parents.

Shirley Huss reported for Treasurer Betty Mason a balance of \$914.64 as of February 9. The club had income since that time of \$45.00 (memberships) and expenses of \$100.00 that was a contribution to Briarwood. The present balance in the bank is \$859.64. The club now has a balance of \$192.28 at the post office for bulk mailing and \$169.88 on account at LSUS printing. Shirley reported for Betty that this is the best condition the treasury has been in several years.

Shirley Huss reported that the club has 118 members.

Hubert Hervey reviewed future field trips. Next Saturday is the field trip to Wardview in north Bossier Parish. May 8, is the North American Migration Count. Charlie Lyon and Paul Dickson are shooting for 150 species on this day. On April 17, the club will visit Briarwood. On May 29, Terry Davis will lead the field trip to find all of the breeding warblers in the area. Next Saturday, March 29, the club will meet with members of the Native Plant society at 8:00 a.m. at the WhatABurger on North Market and take a joint bird-plant field trip. Larry Raymond and Ed Leuck will lead the trip.

Jim Ingold reported that the speaker at the next meeting will be John Darling who will speak about birding in Argentina.

Mac Hardy reported that the new up-to-date form for reporting bird sightings is available. He also reviewed the many ways members could report sightings for inclusion in the club's database.

Larry Raymond said that he would not be present at the next club meeting and will need someone to introduce the speaker. Jim Ingold volunteered.

Jim Ingold proposed an award to an active member once a year. A plaque and a certificate could be given to the recipient of the award. The board voted approval.
