ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Dr. Charles Lyon will provide the March program on "Birding in South Africa." The program will recount a birding trip he took from October 13-24, 1999. He will provide a summary of the birds and sites seen in South Africa during that period of time. Charlie, former president of LOS, has a life list of 3,160 birds worldwide. He has seen 728 species in Africa.

MARCH – APRIL FIELD TRIPS

Mar 11 - Cypress Lake - Black Bayou Recreation Area. This trip was cancelled in February due to rain. Leave McDonald's at I-220 and Airline Drive at 8:00 a. m. This is our second trip to this area, which features woodland and lake birds. The **Bald Eagle** nest was destroyed by a tornado in 1999, a new nest has been built but not on the artificial tower that was erected to replace the huge pine tree that was destroyed. Mar 18 – Weekend Camping at Bodcau WMA. This trip is timed to greet the early spring birds and plants. **Wild Turkeys** are usually seen. Bring your boats and canoes and enjoy the cypress-covered waters of Bodcau Bayou. Enjoy birding the adjoining shoreline and woods. The campground is on the left as you approach the dam. A nominal fee is charged. If you don't camp, come and enjoy birding with us anyway. **Details at March meeting.** Leader: Roy Bott, 925-2265.

Apr 1 - Mooringsport Landfill. Leave WhatABurger at N. Market and I-220 at 7:30 a.m. A half-day spent in grassland and wooded habitat. Early migrants should be present. Leader: Larry Raymond, 929-2806.

Apr 8 - Kisatchie Prairie Habitat Trip. Leave LSUS at 7:00 a.m. Jim has been working on a prairie habitat project for some time and is ready to show us this area, located in Winn Parish. It is our first time to have a trip into this part of Kisatchie National Forest. A full day trip. Leader: Jim Ingold, 797-5236 (W) or (742-5067 (H).

Apr 15 - Briarwood, Caroline Dorman Nature Area. Leave LSUS parking lot at 7:30 a. m. This pristine woodland is unique due to the interest Caroline Dorman had in the trees and plants of Louisiana. Several rare plants are present. We go here to enjoy them as well as the woodland birds that are present. A minimal entrance fee is charged. Leader: Bill Hall, 797-1727.

STOKE'S BIRDS AT HOME ON PBS

There is a new, national, 13-part television series on birding called "Stokes Birds at Home" that will be aired on Shreveport, Louisiana PBS station KLTS – channel 24. The show will air on Saturdays at 12:30 p.m.

THE GREAT LECONTE'S SPARROW ROUND-UP

On Saturday, 19 February 2000, the Shreveport Bird Study Group held its annual winter sparrow banding expedition at Paul Dickson's deer farm. Nets were set up in an area where Paul feeds the birds near his barn. The **LeConte's Sparrows** required a group of people gently pushing the birds towards a net set in a field. Eleven species were mist-netted and banded:

LeConte's Sparrow 4
Song Sparrow 7
Lincoln's Sparrow 4

White-throated Sparrow 6
White-crowned Sparrow 20 new; four retraps

Brown-headed Cowbird 20 (15 females; 5 males)

On Sunday 27 February 2000, I conducted my annual sparrow banding at the Hervey Dairy Farm. The nine species mist-netted and banded were:

Carolina Chickadee 2
Tufted Titmouse 2
Eastern Bluebird 1 male
Chipping Sparrow 19
Field Sparrow 2
White-throated Sparrow 6 and one retrap
White-crowned Sparrow 2 and one retrap
Northern Cardinal 28 and 2 retraps
Red-winged Blackbird 5

Retraps:

White-throated Sparrow: band number 1541-85744 originally banded on 21 February 1999, as an after hatching year bird - so this bird is at least in its 3rd year of life.

White-crowned Sparrow: band number 1441-64481 originally banded on 20 February 1996, as a second year bird - so this bird is in its 6th year of life.

Northern Cardinal: band number 971-91665 originally banded on 6 February 1997, as an after hatching year bird - so this bird is at least in its 4th year of life.

Northern Cardinal: band number 8081-89045 originally banded on 12 March 1998, as an after hatching year bird - so this bird is at least in its 4th year of life.

HUMMINGBIRD NESTS NEED FOR PHOTOGRAPHS

Editor's note: The following was taken from HUMNET-L, a listserv for birders interested in hummingbirds and hummingbird gardens.

As part of a hummingbird book project that Texas Parks and Wildlife is working on with photographers

Sid and Shirley Rucker, we are searching for the following species (not photos, specimens, or zoo birds, please). This is our 'Hit List' and we need your help.

The Ruckers need to photograph in the wild: (1) **Green-breasted Mango** (preferably a bird in first-winter plumage), (2) an active nest of a **Buff-bellied Hummingbird** or **Ruby-throated Hummingbird** or any other nesting U. S. species other than **Black-chinned Hummingbird**, (3) **Plain-capped Starthroat**, (4) **Bumblebee Hummingbird**, (5) **Cinnamon Hummingbird**.

Maybe you know of a reliable location to share. Information is welcome on locations from anywhere in the Southwestern U. S. or northern Mexico. The Ruckers must drive (not fly) with all their specialized equipment to these sites from their home in Texas, so they cannot get there 'extra quick' if it's a wary vagrant hummer or a nesting attempt this spring that is almost done. All assistance will be acknowledged, so please contact me at your earliest convenience. Please note: These birds will not be captured or caged for photographic purposes - all photos would be on the wing and wild.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

February 6, 2000, 7:00 p.m.

Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Hubert Hervey was the speaker at this meeting. He spoke about his research on the viability of **Least Terns** colonies on the Red River. His research was supported by a grant from the Louisiana Ornithological Society. The title of Hubert's presentation was "Gamboling/Gambling on the Red River."

Betty Mason gave the Treasurer's report. The balance as of January 5, 2000 was \$1,493.17. Since that time there

was \$209.63 income and \$21.15 in expenses. The present balance is \$1,681.65. The club has \$322.38 at the LSUS Print Shop and over \$100 at the Post Office. She reported that during the next month, the club would pay annual contributions to various organizations.

The nominating committee was asked to report. However Rosemary Seidler, chair of the committee was not present. Larry Raymond, who is a member of the committee, said that no one had contacted him about nominations.

Terry Davis reported on upcoming field trips. The field trip to Cheneyville to see the **Sandhill Cranes** will be February 12. Participants should meet at the Museum at 7:00 a.m. He also provided information about the bird banding at Paul Dickson's Deer Farm led by Jim Ingold on February 19, and the outing at Cypress Lake on February 26. He said we would check to see if the **Bald Eagle's** nest has been rebuilt.

Jim Ingold reported that he needs someone to write articles for the newsletter. He also mentioned the following items.

a) Information was available on the Alabama Coastal Birding Trail. b) If anyone finds a large group of dead blackbirds that it should be reported to him immediately, but not to do anything else. c) There have been 340 sightings of western hummingbirds in Louisiana this winter. d) The Gulf Coast Bird Club at Lake Charles reported that some club members used our publication "Birding Hot Spots" to bird in the area. They said that the birding was great and that the publication was very helpful.

Bird Talk. Pat Hervey said that she and Hubert still have a **Harris's Sparrow**. Jim Ingold reported a **Rusty Blackbird** at his feeder. He also reported a **Palm Warbler** and **Lapland Longspurs** on the BSG field trip to the Red River Experimental Station. Jim said that he, the Trahan's and Terry Davis saw **Lapland Longspurs**, lots of **Fox Sparrows**, **Vesper Sparrows** and very good looks at **Sprague's Pipits**, when birding in northern Caddo Parish after the wintry weather in late January. Jean Trahan reported a white **Common Grackle** with a dark brown hood in her backyard.
