BIRDS IN FORESTED LANDSCAPES VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Editor's note: This was originally published on LABIRD-L.

I wanted to share with you information about a very important bird conservation initiative you can volunteer for. It's called Birds in Forested Landscapes (BFL). BFL is working to determine the effects of disturbance from recreational development and forest fragmentation on the breeding success of **Cooper's** and **Sharp-shinned Hawks** and on seven species of forest thrushes (**Wood, Hermit, Swainson's, Bicknell's, Gray-cheeked,** and **Varied** as well as **Veery**), several of which are experiencing population declines. You select your own study sites in a forest near you, then census birds on at least two visits. Results from a similar study, Project Tanager, have been written up as a publication now available from the Lab, called "Land Managers Guide to Improving Habitat for Scarlet Tanagers and Other Forest-Interior Birds."

BFL is a great way to gain "in the field" experience; for those of you who are already in the field, it can be easily included in fieldwork you may already be conducting. We send you all research material at no charge. If you can help with either or both of these projects please e-mail me, Allison Wells, at amw25@cornell.edu.

This is the fourth year of the study, and last year we had only a single participant in all of Louisiana. Although Louisiana's BFL breeding birds include only **Cooper's Hawk** and **Wood Thrush**, we could sure use more data about both of these species from Louisiana.

We would appreciate your sharing this note with anyone you think would be interested in helping. Thanks, as always, for your support of the Lab's work.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

March 14, 2000, 7:00 p.m.
Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

The president, Jean Trahan, was not feeling well and left at the beginning of the meeting. Larry Raymond presided at the meeting. Since the secretary was also not feeling well, Rosemary Seidler graciously took the minutes.

Charlie Lyon spoke at this meeting. He showed slides and talked about his birding trip to South Africa in October 1999.

A directory of BSG members was circulated. Members were asked to make corrections and to pass it on.

A sign-up sheet for staying at Rockefeller for the Spring LOS meeting in Cameron was also circulated.

Olga and Walter Clifton will give the program at the next meeting on April 11. The title will be "Nesting Birds."

Mac Hardy gave the treasurer's report for Betty Mason. The balance at City Bank as of February 8, was \$1681.65. Since that time, expenses have been \$448.37. Four hundred dollars of these expenses were donations to The Nature Conservancy, Briarwood, Baton Rouge Audubon Society, and the Caddo Parish Commission. Each of these organizations received a \$100 donation. Income since February 8, was \$107.00. The present balance at the bank is \$1340.28. The club has \$316.22 in the LSUS printing account and \$71.20 on account at the Post Office.

The chair of the elections committee, Rosemary Seidler, asked for volunteers to serve on the club's board.

Lily Poole (membership committee) reported that she added Shreveport, Bossier, Haughton, and Benton high school libraries to the newsletter mailing list. She sent post cards to gratis members and deleted those who were "returned to sender."

Jim Ingold said that he needs articles for the newsletter.

Roy Bott will lead the field trip to Bodcau. This outing will be for camping, canoeing, and birding on March 18 and 19. Larry Raymond will lead the field trip to the Mooringsport Landfill on April 1. Jim Ingold will lead the field trip to the Kisatchie prairies on April 8. Bill Hall will lead the trip to Briarwood on April 15.

Jim Ingold asked that whoever borrowed or accidentally picked up "Coastal Alabama Birding Trails" to please return it.
