Optics can be confusing. Proper selection can mean the difference between years of enjoyment or years of frustration. What do all those numbers mean? What's the difference between those expensive glasses and the cheaper ones? Are full size glasses better than the lightweight compacts?

This workshop will help you understand the differences and get the most out of your binoculars. The various types of binoculars will be examined along with all the confusing specs and numbers. Proper adjustment methods will be described and you will learn how to test your glasses for proper alignment. The advantages and disadvantages of various types of spotting scopes will also be explained.

UPCOMING FIELD TRIPS AND EVENTS by Nancy Menasco

Beginning birders are welcome on all field trips. Membership in the BSG is encouraged but is not required for participation in field trips. Field trips will **LEAVE** the designated meeting place at the time posted for each field trip. Plan to arrive early for field trip orientation and any carpooling/caravanning arrangements.

What to bring on field trips: binoculars, two-way radios, scope, if you have one, snacks, and drinks. Unless otherwise noted, field trips will take place rain or shine, so bring rain gear if the weather's threatening.

THE BIG SIT!

C. Bickham Dickson Park (Red River Education and Research Park)

The 13th Annual Big Sit officially begins at midnight and ends 24 hours later. The Big Sit was founded by the New Haven, Connecticut, Bird Club and is hosted by Birdwatcher's Digest. Participants count from within a 17-foot diameter circle. Swarovski Optik donates \$500 to the team who gets the "Golden Bird," a bird selected by random drawing from all birds sighted. The winning circle chooses a non-profit environmental-based organization to be the recipient of the \$500. This will be the fifth BSG Big Sit at C. Bickham Dickson Park. Last year, due to an all-day rain, our count total was only 39 species, down from 70 species in 2003, 68 species in 2002 and 53 in 2001.

Sitters may come and go at will. Beginning birders are especially encouraged to participate in this event. This is an excellent opportunity to observe behavior and patterns of bird activity over a day's time. Park in the parking lot next to the old horse barn. Signs will lead you to our circle. The circle will be in the field around the first curve of the gated road that leads to the back of the park. We will have access to the restrooms in the old office building. Birds and Hurricanes

The Gulf Coast has recently been devastated by two hurricanes of near record power. Louisiana was the set of books between the twin book-ends of Hurricane Katrina on the east and Hurricane Rita on the west. Our heartfelt sympathy and prayers go out to our friends and fellow Louisiana citizens to the south. Many places we have enjoyed, the beautiful natural areas where we have watched the bird and animal life of the swamps, bayous, woodlands, beaches, and gulf, may never be the same. We will rely on the restorative power of nature, pray for our besieged neighbors, and count our blessings.

Here in northern Louisiana we have learned to watch our rivers and lakes for birds carried northward by hurricane winds. New birds added to our data base include: **Magnificent Frigatebird, Royal Tern, Gullbilled Tern**, and a second record for **Red-necked Grebe**.

Saturday, September 24, 2005. The rains from Hurricane Rita started before daylight and caused cancellation of the hawk watch at Hervey's farm in northern DeSoto Parish. That was okay because the only non-resident bird seen was an eastern form of **Palm Warbler** present Friday and Saturday in the wind and rain.

Sunday, September 25, 2005. A Magnificent Frigatebird was seen on the road to Bishop Point Recreation Area, near Lock and Dam 5 in Caddo Parish by Jeff and Jean Trahan. At 10 A. M. the bird was headed north. An hour later Jeff had his camera ready at the picnic pavilion as the bird came by flying south and got magnificent pictures of it.

Charlie Lyon and Rosemary Seidler saw 2 Royal Terns, and 5 **Laughing Gulls** at Lock and Dam 4 in Red River Parish, and a record high 56 **Common Moorhens** in pools along the roadway into that area.

Monday, September 26, 2005. Ten Red-necked Grebes, and one Royal Tern, were seen by Hubert Hervey and Pat Hervey, at the end of a dirt road at Bishop Point, Pool 5, in Caddo Parish. They swam across the river and into Bossier Parish. At Lock and Dam 4 they saw 5 Laughing Gulls, and 53 Common Moorhens.

Tuesday, September 27, 2005. One Red-necked Grebe was found by Paul Dickson at the same location where ten were seen Monday. Charlie Lyon, Nancy Menasco, Jerry Bertrand, and Linda Adrion found a Gull-billed Tern near Bishop Point, in Caddo Parish. They also saw Royal Terns.

Sunday, October 2, 2005. Herring Gulls, Franklin Gulls, Ring-billed Gulls, and 19 Laughing Gulls, were seen by Charlie Lyon, Nancy Menasco, Jerry Bertrand and Linda Adrion on Cross Lake, near Shreveport in Caddo Parish. My apologies if I failed to include all noteworthy sightings, these are the ones I know about.

Bird Database Notes

Thanks to all of you who submit records for the BSG bird database. We have found several new birds for our area (Magnificent Frigatebird, Gull-billed Tern, and Royal Tern) lately. As a result we have a new "numbers" database for use when submitting records using the BSG bird database system. The database contains the correct common name, the scientific name, the 4-letter abbreviation, and the sequence number for each species of bird in our area. If you need a new copy of the numbers database, let me know (797-5338; lhardy@lsus.edu).

A new feature of the bird database is the capability of producing a list of the species, in the BSG database, based on any selection criteria. For example, we can get a species list for the birds seen at 1823 South Brookwood Drive (my house) during September (29 species total and 16 species only in September).

The BSG bird database is a powerful tool for many questions about the birds of our area. The database now contains more than 167,000 records.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING September 6, 2005 Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Board members participating in the meeting were Ron Martin, Jeff Trahan, Nancy Menasco, Lily Poole, Hubert Hervey, Nan Franks, Jean Trahan, Silviera Hunt, Amanda Crnkovic, Michele Andrews, and Dennis Forshee.

Treasurer's Report – Jean Trahan reported that for the month ending August 31, 2005, the club had \$3,120.80 in the bank. In addition, we had \$415.62 and \$196.91 in prepaid expenses at the post office and LSUS printing, respectively. The fund balance is \$3,733.33.

Board of Directors Vacancy – Ron Martin said that the position of vice president is still vacant. There were no volunteers from the board to take this position.

Birding Trail—A new committee for the Central and North Louisiana Birding Trail was formed. Hubert Hervey will chair the committee and Amanda Crnkovic, Jean Trahan and Nancy Menasco will be committee members. Hubert said that he wants to give a report at the September meeting.

Board Vacancy – Ron Martin said that there is a vacancy on the board. Rosemary Seidler and Lily Poole will comprise the nominating committee for the vacancy. Ron Martin will make an announcement at the September meeting about the vacancy and ask for volunteers to fill the position.

BSG 20th Anniversary – The BSG 20th anniversary will occur in the fall of 2006. Nancy Menasco suggested several activities for the occasion. We could a) Recognize our charter members, b) Host the winter meeting of 2006 for the Louisiana Ornithological Society (LOS) and c) Have patches, commemorative t-shirts, and pins made. Hubert Hervey made a motion to contact the LOS and offer to host the winter meeting. The motion passed.

LOS Winter Meeting – The board decided to appoint a meeting committee at this time because there is so little time before the meeting takes place in January, 2006. Jean Trahan, Nan Franks, Nancy Menasco, Amanda Crnkovic, Silviera Hunt, and Hubert Hervey volunteered to be on the committee.

Donation – Nancy Menasco made a motion to approve a \$100 cash donation to the Red River Refuge Alliance (Friends of the Refuge Group). The motion passed.

Hospitality – Amanda Crnkovic said that she needs help and that we should ask for volunteers to help.

Membership – Lily Poole said that we have 100 paid accounts.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING September 13, 2005, 7:00 p.m., Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Program – Mac Hardy was prepared to show a video of the **Ivory-billed Woodpecker** recently seen in Arkansas. Although he tested the setup ten minutes before the meeting, he could not get the accompanying sound to work after the meeting started. Ron Martin then began the business meeting while Mac Hardy and Jim Ingold attempted to get the sound working. They did not succeed, so later in the meeting we saw the video without the sound.

Board Vacancy – Ron Martin announced a board vacancy and asked for volunteers or nominations for the position.

Field Trips – Nancy Menasco reminded the club of the hawk watch and barbeque on September 24, at Hubert Hervey's house. The watch will begin at 8:00 a.m. She said that the fall Louisiana Ornithological Society (LOS) meeting will take place the last weekend in October and that Rockefeller will be available. She also reported that the BSG will host the winter meeting of the LOS in January.

Nominating Committee – Rosemary Seidler reported that she and Lily Poole are charged with choosing a vice president for the group and that she and Lily will be receptive to ideas for future programs.

Birding Prize – Janis Harrison from Monroe presented a plaque for the North Louisiana Birding Challenge winner for 2004. Of course, the winner was the BSG.

Bird Talk – Norma Cobb has had two Summer Tanagers at her suet feeder. Hubert Hervey reported recent sightings of a Cooper's Hawk and a Broadwinged Hawk at his home. Shirley Huss reported that Pat Lonnecker has an albino hummingbird at her feeder. Rosemary Seidler had two Acadian Flycatchers come to her yard on September 12. Two weeks ago Nan Franks identified an Eastern Screech Owl in her yard. Last month, Nancy Menasco saw Wilson's Phalaropes in large numbers at the Bayou Pierre Unit of the Red River National Wildlife Refuge.

BIRD REPORT – compiled October 4, 2005

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.
