The Nature of Things at Lake Martin

When: Tuesday, May 9, 2006, 6:30 p.m.

Where: LSU in Shreveport Museum of Life Sciences

Nancy Camel, Baton Rouge nature photographer and writer, will present a program based on her book, *The Nature of Things at Lake Martin*. This is a book about a legacy of hope for natural places. Lake Martin is part of Cypress Island Preserve, located south of Breaux Bridge and owned and managed by The Nature Conservancy of Louisiana. Written and photographed by Nancy over the course of five years, the book was debuted April 2006 by Acadian Publishing House of Lafayette. The book is about the birds, the environment and the people of this special place that features one of the most impressive and accessible wading bird rookeries in all of North America.

Nancy Camel retired as the director of a non-profit organization in 1999 to "follow her bliss" and become a full-time professional nature photographer and writer. Since then she has studied with top professional nature photographers through the Rocky Mountain School of Photography and with Arthur Morris, one of the world's foremost bird photographers. She specializes in natural history subjects.

Most recently Nancy spent four months working and photographing at Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks. Future plans call for focusing on south Louisiana

– waterfowl and wading birds, their habitat and allies; landscapes, waterscapes, wildflowers, reptiles, abstracts.

The nature photographer strives to capture "the living art" she sees within nature. Her goal is to merge with the environment or subject she is photographing in order to record the essence of that moment in natural history.

Nancy is donating a copy of *The Nature of Things at Lake Martin* to the Bird Study Group library. Additional autographed copies will be available for purchase at the BSG meeting; the price is \$44.95.

FREEMAN & CUSTIS RED RIVER EXPEDITION OF 1806 SYMPOSIUM

Wednesday, June 14, through Saturday, June 17, 2006

The Louisiana State University in Shreveport Museum of Life Sciences and Noel Memorial Library are sponsoring a bicentennial celebration of the "forgotten" expedition. Commissioned by President Thomas Jefferson to explore the Red River to its headwaters, at that time thought to rise in the mountains near Santa Fe, New Mexico, Thomas Freeman, a civil engineer, and Peter Custis, a botanist, "traversed unexplored land between Natchitoches and southern Arkansas, including the Great Raft, riverside prairies, cedar forests, and cane brakes" before being turned back by the Spanish. Ivory-billed Woodpeckers, Swallow-tailed Kites, Carolina Parakeets, American bison, and prairie gentians are only a few of the species noted in the expedition logs. Considered a failure and an embarrassment by Jefferson, the expedition nevertheless "had lasting cultural, environmental, and ecological ramifications for the region as well as immediate political consequences."

The symposium will celebrate "The Grand Excursion" of Freeman and Custis by re-examining the middle Red River region then and now. Historians, natural scientists, archaeologists, cultural anthropologists, and Caddo tribal elders, will gather to share their knowledge, observations, and insights. Dr. Dan Flores, leading expert on the Red River expedition, will deliver the keynote address for a program of outstanding presentations."

Symposium presentations are free and open to the public; however, there is a fee for lunch on Thursday and Friday and the all-day Saturday trip on the Red River in a luxury barge provided by the Vicksburg District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Birding Competition – Nancy Menasco won the birding competition because she saw the most species in each of the eight BSG parishes except for DeSoto Parish where Hubert Hervey won the competition. Nancy Menasco won the prize for most the most species seen in a parish in the BSG area. She saw 212 species. In the Life List Competition Linda Adrion won having added a total of seven species to her life list. Jim Ingold, Nancy Menasco and Linda Adrion all won the golden bird prize.

This was a life bird for her. She also saw a **Whip-poor-will** at Stoner Woods thanks to Terry Davis. Susan Martin has seen a **Hooded Warbler** in her yard and a **Scarlet Tanager** near her house. Hubert Hervey still has three banded **Harris' Sparrows** coming to his feeders. Betty Mason called Mac Hardy and said that she has a **Yellow-crowned Night Heron** nesting in her yard. Nancy Menasco also reported four **Lincoln's Sparrows** at the Red River NWR recently on Sunday.

BIRD REPORT – compiled May 2, 2006

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.
