### UPCOMING FIELD TRIPS AND EVENTS

Beginning birders are welcome on all field trips. Membership in the BSG is encouraged but is not required for participation in field trips. Field trips will **LEAVE** the designated meeting place at the time posted for each field trip. Plan to arrive early for field trip orientation and any carpooling/caravanning arrangements.

What to bring on field trips: binoculars, two-way radios, scope, if you have one, snacks, and drinks. Unless otherwise noted, field trips will take place rain or shine, so bring rain gear if the weather's threatening.

### LOWER MISSISSIPPI VALLEY SHOREBIRD COUNT

*Saturday, September 9 – Sunday, September 10, 2006*

This is the third and final weekend for the 2006 count sponsored by the Lower Mississippi Valley Joint Venture (LMVJV) Shorebird Monitoring Program. Even if you didn't count in August, you can still participate in the September count. The objective of the Shorebird Monitoring Program is to ensure that adequate habitat for migrating shorebirds is provided on managed public lands as a safety net during years when habitat conditions outside of public lands are poor. Enter your observations directly into the database at [www.lmvjv.org/shorebird](http://www.lmvjv.org/shorebird). You may count wherever you like for as long as you like. You are encouraged to enter your shorebird sightings at any time of the year (not just the count weekends) in the LMVJV database. Visit the website to learn more about the program and to

register. Remember to report your observations to the BSG database as well.

## THE BIG SIT!

C. Bickham Dickson Park (Red River Education and Research Park)

Founded by the New Haven, Connecticut, Bird Club and hosted by Birdwatcher's Digest, 2006 will mark the 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Big Sit. From its beginnings as a strictly North American affair, the Big Sit has grown to include teams in India, Panama, Vietnam, the Netherlands, and the United Kingdom. In 2005, a record 171 teams in a record 54 states and countries participated. Swarovski Optik donates \$500 to the team who gets the "Golden Bird," a bird selected by random drawing from all birds sighted. The winning circle then chooses a non-profit environmental-based organization to be the recipient of the \$500.

For the sixth straight year, BSG sitters will sit the Big Sit at C. Bickham Dickson Park. Although the official BSG Big Sit tarpaulin has had to be replaced over the years, the diameter of the count circle remains at 17 feet. We have endured heat, cold, rain, and wind (in other words, typical Louisiana autumn weather) to amass a cumulative total of 96 species over the past five years. Our 2005 total of 70 species tied our previous high count from 2003. In prior years we had no trouble maintaining the top spot in Louisiana because, except for occasional participation by Van Remsen in St. Gabriel, we have been the only team in the state. That changed in 2005 when the upstart LSU (Baton Rouge) Bird Club fielded its first team and reported an impressive 91 species from a circle located at Richfield Riversilt on the Mississippi River.

The Big Sit officially begins at midnight and ends 24 hours later; BSG sitters have always been in the field by 6:30 a.m., manning the circle continuously until at least 7:30 p.m. The LSU team by contrast started the day at

4:30 a.m. Any Sitters wishing to man the circle before 6:30 a.m. will need to contact Nancy Menasco so we can make arrangements to let you in the gate.

Sitters may come and go at will. Park in the parking lot next to the old horse barn. Signs will lead you to our circle. The circle will be in the field around the first curve of the gated road that leads to the back of the park. We will have access to the restrooms in the old office building. In case of rain, the circle will be located on the covered porch of the old office building. For more background on The Big Sit, go to

## LEAST TERN REPORT, 2006

This was an unusual year for my efforts to take a meaningful census of the **Least Tern** populations, breeding on the sandy islands and sand bars of the Red River in Arkansas and Louisiana. Injuries to the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers naturalist, who usually accompanies me, and his unexpectedly slow recovery, prevented me from making the July and August surveys in Louisiana (with the exception of an August survey of

the Boyce colony). After a couple of aborted attempts to survey the Arkansas colonies, I put out a call for help, and thanks to friends such as Jerry Bertrand, Mac Hardy, and Jack Land, I was able to cover all of the Arkansas colonies from Index to the Louisiana state line during July. This report includes an accurate total of adult **Least Terns** nesting on the Red River in my area of responsibility in Arkansas, and all of Louisiana. I am able to complete the Louisiana total by including the 151 terns counted on June 26 and 27, from the bridge at LA 2 to Cash Point, by Jack Culpepper, the Lafayette biologist with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The report will not even come close to accurately assessing the success of nesting, as that aspect of **Least Tern** studies requires more frequent trips than I am able to make. All of my survey data is turned over to Casey Lott, Coordinator with the American Bird Conservatory, Endangered Interior Least Tern Working Group.

The totals are down some from previous years. I hope to have a summary of all years to hand out at an upcoming Bird Study Group meeting. Arkansas and Louisiana surveys totaled 410 adult **Least Terns**, and 30 young birds, including all ages. The breakdown is 233 adults and one juvenile in Louisiana, and 177 adults and 29 juveniles in Arkansas. The Boyce colony had 40 adult **Least Terns** on 15 June 06, with 14 incubating. By 12 Aug 06, they were all fledged. This seems an uncommonly early date for all the nesting to be completed, and the young fledged and shown the route to the south. Without more consistent monitoring of known colonies, their success or failure will never be known with certainty.

Some notes and tales might be of interest. Jack Land and I made a survey of the river from Index to the Allen Ferry launch by canoe. Twenty-six miles by canoe is quite a paddle. As we were quietly rounding a bend we surprised a young cougar in the mouth of a den. It was only 20 feet away. It happened too quickly to take any pictures, and the animal went up the bank while we were trying to turn around and get cameras ready. On a return trip the next week we learned that the landowners have seen six cougars in the last five years, once seeing two kittens.

I had a misadventure when I ran into a sandbar, as has happened hundreds of times before, but this time my motor bounced out of the boat and into the water. I immediately followed it, traced the gas line under water, and pulled the motor up to the transom. The cylinders had filled with water, and the motor would not start. I was over 20 miles from anywhere possible to reach. I was able to call my wife on her cell phone, and she notified the Miller County Rescue Squad that they had a man that needed rescuing in the Red River. They took

three hours to get there, during which time the dispatcher got to know my wife quite well after numerous calls. They had a boat way too big for the low water level (minus 2.3 feet at Fulton that morning) they had no fluids or food. But they did have a continual supply of cigarettes. It was good to be rescued, but what would have happened had I really needed help. The experience I was able to give the rescue squad in operating a boat down a shallow river will really come in handy if they ever have a serious need to rescue somebody. I am 71 years old and that was my first rescue. I found it sort of embarrassing, being the self-sufficient sort that I am.

The following week, Mac Hardy and I were scheduled to make the 38-mile run from Garland to Spring Bank. We got ready to launch and I pumped the gas bulb to fill up the line. Gas spewed everywhere.

The strain of being rescued from the river had done in my gas line, although it had run fine in the barrel in the back yard, after I had taken the motor apart and washed it out with WD-40. We had to come back to Shreveport, purchase a replacement line and bulb, install it and test it. This shortened our time on the river by five hours, and we made the much shorter run from Spring Bank to LA 2 Bridge, getting in just before sunset. So as mentioned in the first paragraph of this article, this has been a different season for tern surveys. I eagerly anticipate every trip, and am still learning something new on each one. After all, isn't that what keeps us truly young, despite the encroaching years.

### One if by Land, Two if by Water

This article briefly compiles the miles and hours spent making **Least Tern** surveys on the Red River in Arkansas and Louisiana by the author, volunteers who assisted him, the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, and the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. At the start I ask the question, "Whose job is it to survey endangered species?" There are supposed to be mandates for monitoring endangered species for certain government agencies, and it does not include private citizens who are motivated by a concern, rather than a paycheck. The miles and times for government agencies are my own estimation based on the starting location and the portion of the river they surveyed. Incidentally, the survey would not have been complete without their participation.

Miles and Hours spent traveling by vehicle to a survey location:

Hubert Hervey:	2,360 miles, 50.5 hours
Other Volunteers:	1,110 miles, 35 hours
USACE:	700 miles, 18.5 hours
USFWS:	600 miles, 10 hours

Miles and Hours spent traveling by boat on the Red River:

Hubert Hervey:	318 miles, 55 hours
Other Volunteers:	276 miles, 34 hours
USACE:	86 miles, 19 hours
USF&WS:	70 miles, 12 hours

## The Bird Study Group is Twenty Years Old!

In 2006 Shreveport's Bird Study Group (BSG) celebrates its twentieth anniversary as a birding club but the BSG's roots extend over fifty years into the past to February 4th, 1954, when the Shreveport Society for Nature Study (SSNS) was incorporated. Over a period of years, the SSNS sponsored a series of nature-oriented films. As nature programs became commonplace on television, the SSNS was on the verge of disbanding when on September 16, 1986, a group of interested parties led by Paul Dickson met at the Louisiana State University in Shreveport Museum of Life Sciences. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the formation of a Bird Study Group, which would continue the Shreveport Society for Nature Study's mission of "advancing knowledge in the natural sciences." After several more meetings, the SSNS Bird Study Group was born.

Today the Bird Study Group has grown to over 130 members, thirteen of whom are charter members from 1986, Dot Cady, Paul Dickson, Carol Foster, Bill and Jane Hall, Mac Hardy, Shirley Huss, Horace Jeter, Pat Lonacker, Betty Mason, Larry Raymond, and Robert and Bobbe Womack. Horace Jeter also holds the distinction of being the only present BSG member who was one of the founding members of the Shreveport Society for Nature Study in 1954. The BSG membership is an active and enthusiastic bunch, participating in counts, surveys, challenges, and whatever else comes our way. BSG members are compilers of four northwestern Louisiana Christmas Bird Counts; Shreveport, Bossier-Caddo-Bienville, Natchitoches, and Claiborne. The Shreveport Christmas Bird Count, originated by Horace Jeter on December 24, 1950, is the oldest, continuously run CBC in the state of Louisiana.

The BSG serves an eight-parish area in northwestern Louisiana, including the parishes of Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Claiborne, DeSoto, Natchitoches, Red River, and Webster. The area's habitat is varied but the common thread for most of the region, as it is for the rest of Louisiana, is water. The Red River, where the endangered interior **Least Tern** may still be found nesting on a few sandbars, flows through four of our parishes. Among the more usual shorebirds migrating along the Red, the yellowlegs, the dowitchers, the **Pectoral Sandpipers**, and the **Stilt Sandpipers**, is an occasional **Ruddy Turnstone**, godwit, or **Piping Plover**. You never know what you might see on the river; witness, a BSG boat trip in late August of 2004, when an alternate-plumaged adult **Sabine's Gull** (extremely rare for Louisiana) flew over the delighted

participants. The establishment of the Red River National Wildlife Refuge, the only National Wildlife Refuge in northwestern Louisiana with units in Bossier, DeSoto, Red River, and Natchitoches Parishes, holds the promise for long-term protection of habitat for birds and other wildlife along the Red River.

Other lakes, rivers, and bayous in our area provide more excellent birding opportunities. In Caddo Parish, Cross Lake is noted for its wintering gulls and waterfowl and has been visited over the years by such rarities as **Ringed Kingfisher**, **Tropical Parula**, **Red-throated Loon**, and assorted jaegers and scoters. Caddo Lake, where legends of its larger-than-life former inhabitants dwell among the baldcypress swamps, spans the Louisiana-Texas border. Named for the Caddo Indians, it is the site of the Caddo Lake Winter Warm-up Count, a joint effort of the Northeast Texas Field Ornithologists and the Bird Study Group.

Claiborne Parish is well known at least in the northern part of the state as "the **Greater Roadrunner** capital of Louisiana." Lake Claiborne, one of the deepest lakes in the state, has nesting **Bald Eagles** and is the winter residence of at least one pair of **Common Loons**. Other major bodies of water include Lake Bistineau, bounded by Bossier, Bienville, and Webster Parishes, and Cypress Lake in Bossier Parish, another **Bald Eagle** nesting site. The Sabine River flows through the Toledo Bend Reservoir to form DeSoto Parish's border with Texas and Bayou Pierre extends from Caddo Parish through DeSoto and Red River Parishes until it joins the Red River in Natchitoches Parish. The Bayou Bodcau watershed, encompassing over 30,000 acres in Bossier and Webster Parishes, forms one of the most important migratory bird corridors in the region. The diversity of bird life reflects the diversity of habitats, ranging from swamps to prairie remnants to old pine stands, as Bayou Bodcau hosts resident **White-breasted Nuthatch**, a nesting species unique to the northern part of Louisiana, and **Wild Turkey**, and most if not all of the warbler species nesting in northwestern Louisiana, including **Prairie Warbler**, **Yellow-throated Warbler**, and **Prothonotary Warbler**.

The Bird Study Group maintains a database of over 170,000 bird records from the BSG area in conjunction with the LSU in Shreveport (LSUS) Museum of Life Sciences. The BSG publishes the birding guide, "Birding Hot Spots of Northwestern Louisiana," now in its second edition, which describes sixteen of the best publicly accessible birding locations in our area. Our website has recent sightings, downloadable field checklists, including monthly and site-specific, and a seasonal occurrence chart. Meetings are held on the

second Tuesday of each month, except July and August, in the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences, beginning at 7 p.m.

## BIRD REPORT – compiled August 28, 2006

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 25<sup>th</sup> of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.
