UPCOMING FIELD TRIPS AND EVENTS

Beginning birders are welcome on all field trips. Membership in the BSG is encouraged but is not required for participation in field trips. Field trips will **LEAVE** the designated meeting place at the time posted for each field trip. Plan to arrive early for field trip orientation and any carpooling/caravanning arrangements.

What to bring on field trips: binoculars, two-way radios, scope, if you have one, snacks, and drinks. Unless otherwise noted, field trips will take place rain or shine, so bring rain gear if the weather's threatening.

THE BIG SIT!

C. BICKHAM DICKSON PARK (RED RIVER EDUCATION AND RESEARCH PARK)

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2007, BEFORE DAWN 'TIL AFTER DARK

Founded by the New Haven, Connecticut, Bird Club and hosted by Birdwatcher's Digest, this will be the 15th Annual Big Sit. Swarovski Optik donates \$500 to the team who gets the "Golden Bird," a bird selected by random drawing from all birds sighted. The winning circle then chooses a non-profit environmental-based organization to be the recipient of the \$500.

For the seventh straight year, BSG sitters will sit the Big Sit at C. Bickham Dickson Park. Last year's total of 50 species was the lowest total since we began sitting in 2001 except for the Big Sit of 2004 when it rained all day. We have reported a total of 97 species in six years: 2001 – 53 species; 2002 – 68 species; 2003 – 70 species; 2004 – 39 species; 2005 – 70 species; 2006 – 50 species.

The Big Sit officially begins at midnight and ends 24 hours later; BSG sitters have always been in the field by 6:30 a.m., manning the circle continuously until at least 7:30 p.m. Any Sitters wishing to man the circle before 6:30 a.m. will need to contact Nancy Menasco so we can make arrangements to let you in the gate.

Sitters may come and go at will. Park in the parking lot next to the old horse barn. Signs will lead you to our circle. The circle will be in the field around the first curve of the gated road that leads to the back of the park. We will have access to the restrooms in the old office building. After two-and-a-half years, LOS returns to Cameron Parish! The Cameron Motel is open and has about 50-60 rooms. The next closest lodging is in Lake Charles. The Friday and Saturday night meetings will be held in Creole. MINUTES OF THE JULY BOARD MEETING

July, 2007

Internet Email Meeting

The board had planned to have a board meeting immediately following the June 12 regular club meeting to elect officers. However, at that time the board did not have quorum. So, the president Ron Martin asked to schedule another meeting of the board to select officers.

By an email vote of 6 to 3 on July 5, the board selected to do the meeting by email in lieu of scheduling a meeting. The following nomination was made and seconded: President, Amanda Crnkovic; Vice President, Mac Hardy; Secretary, Jeff Trahan; Treasurer, Jean Trahan. Another nomination had been made where Mac Hardy would be President and Amanda Crnkovic would be Vice President. However, each of them declined those positions. Nominations closed July 7. Board members voted by email and on July 19, the president disseminated the results of the vote: President, Amanda Crnkovic; Vice President, Mac Hardy; Secretary, Jeff Trahan; Treasurer, Jean Trahan.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

September 11, 2007, 7:00 p.m.

Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Program – The first speaker of the year was Mac Hardy. The title of his talk was: “A View from Wallace’s Line.” He talked about a trip he took this August to Borneo, Malaysia, and Indonesia. Mac could not complete his presentation because of problems with the computer projection system.

Meeting Time – The president, Amanda Crnkovic, said that she would like to start the meeting one-half hour earlier. A motion was made to serve refreshments at 6:00 p.m. and start the presentation at 6:30 p.m., beginning with the October meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.

Least Terns – Hubert Hervey reported that he continued to do **Least Tern** surveys on the Red River. He was on the river ten times this season and saw a total of 41 terns and very little evidence of nesting. On the July 4 survey of the Red River, no terns were found from Index, Arkansas, to the Mississippi River. The reason for the lack of terns is that the river has been very high during May, June, July and August, and the sand bars which provide nesting spots for the terns have been under water.

Field Trips – Hubert Hervey said that the annual fall hawk watch would take place on his farm on September 22. If you go you should think about bringing a side dish. You must tell Hubert that you will be there so that preparations can be made for the watch. Nancy Menasco reported on other field trips. The Haynesville Butterfly Festival will take place September 22 in Haynesville. The spring LOS meeting will be held in Cameron Parish this year on the last weekend of October. The meeting will take place in Creole, LA.

The LOS winter meeting will be held in Alexandria. Finally, the Big Sit will take place in Bickham Dickson Park on October 14.

Hospitality – Amanda Crnkovic reminded everyone that she is the hospitality chair in addition to being president. She suggested that we should do hospitality differently this year. She asked that volunteer club members be responsible for refreshments at meetings. She passed around a sign-up sheet so that club members could sign up for a specific meeting at which they would be responsible for refreshments.

Membership – Mac Hardy has asked members to pay their dues. He reported that there are 205 active members.

Newsletter – Jim Ingold provided many excuses for the newsletter being late for the first meeting. He said that it should be on time from now on.

Publicity – Amanda Crnkovic said that the club needs someone to be chair of the publicity committee and asked if someone would volunteer. Rachel Demascal volunteered.

Bird Talk – John Dillon reported a **Cooper's Hawk** outside of Raising Cane. Roy Henderson said that he saw a totally white dove or pigeon in the field near Lowes that had a tuft on its head and a band across its tail. Jean Trahan reported many herons, egrets, ibis, and peeps at Bickham Dickson Park. This has occurred because of the high water in the park providing habitat for these birds. She said that you would have to walk into the park from the locked gate to see the birds. Nan Franks saw **Canada Geese** near Champion Lake. Nancy Menasco reported that this last summer was a great summer for **Baltimore Orioles**. She said that you have to be in the river bottom land to be able to attract these birds and she explained how she did that using a hummingbird feeder. Steve Bankston saw a **Greater Roadrunner** on LA5 between Kickapoo and Keatchie.

BIRD REPORT – *compiled October 3, 2007*

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.

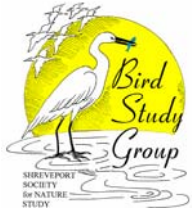

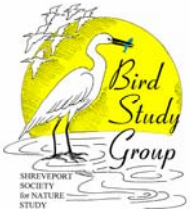
