#### MINUTES OF MARCH 30th BOARD MEETING

Will reported on the five Purple Martin houses placed around the city by the Bird Study Group: two at Bickham Dickson Park already have Martins; two at Barnwell Center, and one at the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences [also with Martins]. He also stated that a check of the Bluebird houses installed last year at Bickham Dickson Park have Bluebirds flying in their vicinity.

Regarding the Survey enclosed in the February Newsletter: only seven replys have been filled out. Will suggested that they be handed out at the next meeting to be filled out and left at the door upon adjournment.

Meeting called to order by Steve Klotz. Members who had not returned the suggestion forms from the newsletter filled out their comments about future meetings and programs.

The Treasurer reported that after a large bill for seed, the balance stands at \$674.61.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Steve urged members to take home bird-sighting cards, to be filled with data concerning "every-day" birds, as

mell as unusual occurances or mehavior. These cards will form a arge data base for future study of pirds in this area.

Will Smolenski displayed a Bluebird house built of treated plyrood that is on sale in the Gift Shop for \$15.00. He will assemble the houses, which are made by Coates fanufacturing Co. of Bossier City.

Three door prizes were offered: River Birch tree won by Mary Blackman, and two Dogwoods, won by Bill Wood and Vera Lee Grubbs.

The group is offering Serviceperry trees for sale for \$10. These trees will grow in full sun or shade, needing only good drainage and ample water. Birds known to feed on the Serviceberry include: American Goldfinch, American Robin; Blue Jay, Brown Thrasher, Cedar waxwing, Dark-eyed Junco, Downy Bluebird, Eastern Moodpecker. Eastern Phoebe, Evening Grosbeak, Thrush. Catbird, Hermit Grey Northern Flicker, Red-eyed Mockingbird, Purple Finch, Yellow-Vireo, Scarlet Tanager, bellied Sapsucker, and Yellow-rumped Warbler.

Mac Hardy showed two large bird prints from the American Birding Association, on sale for \$5.00 each. Guests were introduced.

Brad McPherson gave a very interesting program on Fossil Birds. The meeting was adjourned.

Volume V --warblers, orioles, blackbirds, tanagers, grosbeaks, finches, buntings, and sparrows.
