Acceptance into the Louisiana Master Naturalist, Northwest Louisiana Chapter Program is based on receipt of the registration and course fees (\$100.00) on a first-received first-accepted basis. No refunds will be given once your fees have been received and you have agreed to participate in the program. Depending on the needs of the instructor/s for each session, additional fees may be charged for materials, special transportation needs, etc. These will be kept to a minimum. Registration for the course is a commitment to attend the orientation plus seven of the nine sessions offered. Training will be limited to 20 or so individuals per course. Trainees are required to attend a minimum of the orientation and 7 of the 9 training workshops, including Biodiversity & Ecology and Interpretation & Volunteering, and score 80% or better on the final exam.
