Presentation: El Cielo Nature Festival: Birds and
Butterflies of Northeastern Mexico, by Rosemary
Seidler

El Cielo, the sky, was set aside by the State of Tamaulipas as protected land in 1985. In 1987 it was designated as a Biosphere Reserve by the United Nations. The Reserve, just south of the Tropic of Cancer, is the Western Hemisphere's northern-most cloud forest. The biodiversity of the Reserve is among the highest in the world. The first joint ecotour by the State of Tamaulipas and Texas Parks and Recreation was held in 1994 to acquaint Texans with the natural resources in the area. Since that time ecotourism has replaced logging as the major industry of the area. This presentation will mention some of the challenges faced by the people and the Reserve. Many photos of the birds (Blue-crowned Motmot, Yellow-throated Euphonia, Blue Mockingbird) and butterflies (Rainbow Beamer, Anna's Eighty-eight, Paula Clearwing) seen there will be shown.

Directions to the Metzler lake house in Karnack, TX: From the intersection of LA 169 and Old Mooringsport Road (LA 538) in Mooringsport, LA, go west on LA 169 through Mooringsport approximately 0.2 miles, then turn left (south) to continue on LA 169. Proceed south on LA 169 approximately 7.3 miles and turn right (west) on the Blanchard-Latex Road (PR 6). Proceed west for approximately 9.2 miles (PR 6 changes to FM 1999 at the state line) and turn right (north) on FM 134 in Leigh. TX. Proceed north on FM 134 for 5.2 miles to Karnack, TX, and keep straight on CR 2606 for 0.7 miles. Turn right (northeast) on FM 2198 and proceed for 1.2 miles and turn left on Pine Island Road (CR 2412). Pine Island Road is the first paved road that turns left off of FM 2198 after you pass the State Park. You'll see a bunch of signs at this turnoff, including a big one that says "Big Pines - down yonder." Stay on Pine Island Road until you pass Big Pines Lodge, and turn right on Dorough Road (CR 2413). Follow Dorough Road about 1½ miles to the Metzlers' lake house. It is on the left. Look for a big grayish metal barn; there is a white fire hydrant with a red cap in front.

Participants at the Big Sit at Bickham Dickson Park counted 50 species. This was the lowest species count except for the one for which it rained all day.

Bird Talk – Terry Davis reported eight Palm Warblers and a Burrowing Owl at Cain's Landing. The Burrowing Owl is the first record of this species for northwestern Louisiana. Hubert Hervey said that a neighbor called him about a Bald Eagle in his neighborhood. Hubert went to see it because he had never had a record of this species on his farm, but it turned out to be a Red-tailed Hawk. Paul Miliotis reported a massive fall-out of warblers at Caddo Lake. Mac Hardy saw a Greater Roadrunner ten days ago on Bert Kouns Industrial Loop near the intersection of I-49. Nan Franks recently spotted a Greater Roadrunner on the Southern Loop.

BIRD REPORT – compiled October 26, 2006

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 25th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.



This year marks the tenth Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC). The count has expanded past the backyard to include anywhere you choose to bird. The BSG has enthusiastically participated in this annual event over the past several years and we hope that all of you will consider getting involved this year.

The BSG database lists over 175 species that have been found in our area in the month of February, including rarities. Download a February (or any other monthly) checklist from the BSG website at www.birdstudygroup.org/SelectMoCheck.html.

For the second year, awards will be given to localities with the highest number of species, the highest number of birds sighted, and the most checklists submitted. There is also a photo contest. Complete instructions for participation are available on the GBBC website, but the guidelines are simple: For each day of the count period, report the highest number of a particular species recorded at each location you bird. For example, on day one of the count, in your backyard you have one Northern Cardinal at 10:00 a.m., five at noon, and two at 2:00 p.m. You report five Northern Cardinals for your backyard (the highest number present at one time) for day one. You go birding the same day at Richard Fleming Park, where you spot six cardinals in one You report six Northern Cardinals for Richard Fleming Park. You start all over again for days two, three, and four.

To learn more about the count and to enter your reports, go to www.birdsource.org/gbbc. Record entry is a simple process. The following instructions are from the GBBC website. If you don't find a particular species listed on the GBBC checklist for Louisiana, you may need to click on "Show this checklist with rare species included" at the top of the checklist page.

At the end of the day, go to "Submit your bird checklist" on the GBBC web site. Fill out the questions about your location, local habitat, and count duration. Then enter your high counts for each species sighted on that day and location. You can submit one bird checklist for each day that you count or for each new area that you count in. For example:

- o If you count on four days at one location, you'd submit four different checklists.
- o If you count on four days at two different locations each day, submit eight checklists. And so on.

A Fantastic Day For a Hawk Watch (Five Days after the Celebration)

The main flight of Broad-winged Hawks had failed to materialize as September, 2006 was winding down. I always look forward to a day when a hundred or even rarely two hundred hawks migrate over my farm in northern DeSoto Parish. But 2006 had failed to produce any strong cool fronts that would initiate a major hawk movement over north Louisiana. That is until September 28, 2006. Conditions were good the previous day, with cumulus clouds following the passage of a front, but only a few hawks passed by. Thursday, the 28th was predicted to be cloudless; not perfect hawk watch conditions. Indeed as I checked the weather about 9 a.m. the sky was cloudless, and doomed to stay that way. However, at 10:05 a.m. Terry Davis called and said he was seeing a few Broad-wings at a location about twelve miles north of me. He started counting them, and got to 70, counting by ones, when I decided I needed to finish the job I was doing. I was outside at 10:15 a.m. Ten minutes later the biggest kettle of Broad-winged Hawks it has been my pleasure to see in Louisiana started gathering right over my head. I counted the milling throng, looking like a buzzing of bees, far

overhead. I got to 550, and decided that wife Pat needed to see this bubbling brew of Broad-wings. I tried to dash inside, and ran right out of my moose hide moccasins. My binoculars crashed to earth, under my chest. Flesh will always loose this nature of battle, and I still have the bruises to prove it. Pat missed this flight, but at 11:15 a.m. I was able to get her out in time to see another flight of 155 Broad-winged Hawks. Later another four came over playing catch up. The day's total of 709 broadwings is a high count for our area. How many more broad-wings passed over north Louisiana that day? Rosemary Seidler reported 480 over Eddie Jones Park, a location 15 miles west of mine, at 3:00 p.m. certainly a different group. Those seen by Terry Davis might have been a different group also. All these hawks were streaming south-southwest, on an upper level airflow in a very clear blue sky, regrouping to kettle only once while in sight, and covering real estate rapidly. Also, they were binocular only birds, not likely to be seen by the naked eve. The following weekend at Hazel Bazemore County Park, northwest of Corpus Christi, the official hawk count had over 110,000 Broad-winged Hawks.

Crawfish and Waterbirds – What We Do and Don't Know About Their Interactions in Aquaculture Situations

The modern Louisiana crawfish industry is about 50 vears old and has grown from around 40 hectares in 1950 to over 52,000 hectares in the year 2006. Waterbirds have vexed crawfish farmers since the industry's earliest days. Flocks of several thousand birds in ponds are regularly encountered and such high densities of crawfish predators and competitors would appear to be potentially detrimental to crawfish production. Our report summarizes information about the problems, real and perceived, associated with various waterbird species in crawfish ponds. As yet, no definitive studies have determined whether or not "perceived" problems are "real". However, "perceived" problems cause concern among crawfish farmers and should be of concern to those charged with addressing wildlife damage complaints.

Concern about waterbirds involves several issues. Direct predation on crawfish is a clear issue. Birds are also competitors for crawfish food resources, including invertebrates, small vertebrate animals, and un-harvested seeds. Birds impact harvesting by removing bait and/or crawfish from traps as well as knocking traps over permitting crawfish to escape. Finally, some birds dislodge emergent vegetation that functions as crawfish

substrate, by providing protective cover, reducing absolute density per unit area and providing access to the surface during periods of low dissolved oxygen. Specific bird groups include: grebes, pelicans, cormorants, egrets, herons, night-herons, ibises, spoonbills, storks, geese, dabbling ducks, diving ducks, coots, shorebirds, gulls, and terns.

Information about control methods for dispersing birds including non-lethal harassment, exclosures, management of water depth and vegetative cover, and crawfish trap modification will be presented. The seasonality of "problem" birds varies and will be discussed. Birds are present throughout the year. Although most crawfish are invulnerable in burrows during the summer when rice crops are often grown in fields, some farmers report waterbird problems then. These will be explained. Finally, the relative importance of crawfish pond systems for various waterbird species will be presented.

Some in the conservation community argue that waterbirds may have beneficial impacts on crawfish production. Because stunting is related to high crawfish densities, reduction in crawfish numbers could enhance production of larger, more valuable crawfish. Cycling of nutrients to macrobenthos and zooplankters, both important crawfish food organisms, might also benefit crawfish production. These issues will be discussed.

During the past two decades, approximately 100 waterbird species have been documented using Louisiana's agricultural wetland complex. An additional 180 species of birds, native and migrant, have been recorded in adjacent riparian areas, bottomland hardwood forests, and marshes. The significance of these "artificial" wetlands adjacent to the state's disappearing coastal wetlands, over 70,000 hectares in the past half century, cannot be overstated. Likewise, the expansion of crawfish culture along the Red River and Ouachita River valleys into central and northern parts of the state has provided significant shallow water and moist soil habitat for birds moving toward the coast in fall migration or from the coast in spring migration.

Birding in Oregon and California September-October 2006

I was in Oregon and California birding from 29 September through 8 October 2006. I made the trip through BirdTreks – Bob Schutsky, Peach Bottom, Pennsylvania [www:birdtreks.com] . I chose this tour primarily because Bob is the only bird tour operator I have found who intentionally targets the Cameron area in Louisiana for birding tours each spring. Bob's list for the Oregon tour was very interesting with a potentially spectacular pelagic trip. I also wanted to learn more about his efforts to promote birding in the Cameron area.

Several of us arrived on the 28th and birded the following morning, the 29th, in riparian areas along the Columbia River near the air port while waiting for other folks to arrive. We left in early afternoon for Newport and had several birding stops along the way at the coast finding **Heerman's** and **Mew Gulls** at Tillamook Bay. We stopped at one site noted for exposed mud flats at "high" tide in Lane's guide to check for shorebirds. Needless to say, we found few shorebirds!

On the 30th of September we birded along the coast with stops in places like Siletz Bay and Boiler Bay. We had excellent birding from the shore finding **Brandt's** and **Pelagic Cormorants**, **Harlequin Duck**, **Common Murre**, **Black Oystercatcher**, **Black Turnstone**, **Black, White-winged**, and **Surf Scoters**, and **Surfbird** along with several loons and grebes. Gray whales seemed to be all over the place. An **Eurasian Wigeon** showed up in a huge flock of **American Wigeons** in a large, shallow bay. We found **Western** and **Glaucous-winged Gulls** as well as many hybrids of the two species. Talk about confusing birding! We found my first **Chestnut-backed Chickadee** at a roadside park where we had lunch.

The pelagic trip on the 1st of October was the highlight for my tour. We traveled to Heceta Bank guided by Greg Gillson, roughly 30 miles offshore. We were treated to large numbers of seabirds and very smooth seas, a rare condition for most pelagic birding trips. I had two target birds, any puffin and any crossbill. Timing was terrible for puffins because they had long since departed from their breeding sites and were widely dispersed across the Pacific Ocean. However, we cruised right up to a winter plumage **Tufted Puffin** that allowed our boat to cruise around it so all could see its coal black plumage and bright orange bill. I managed the following lifers at sea: Black-footed Albatross, Northern Fulmar, Pink-footed, Buller's and Sooty Shearwaters, South Polar Skua, Pigeon Guillemot, Marbled Murrelet, and Cassin's and Rhinoceros Auklets.

Pomarine, **Parasitic** and **Long-tailed Jaegers** were literally all over the place once we got out of sight of land. We stopped to chum birds around noon and the first bird to arrive was a magnificent adult **Sabine's Gull**, a lifer as well. We got so close to a Gray Whale that the boat passed through its exhaled breath immediately after it broached. The smell was horrendous! We left the coast on the 2nd of October and tried for **Spotted Owl** at a site recommended by a guide on the pelagic trip. While we did not find the owl, I was treated to two lifers, the **Varied Thrush** and my other target bird the **Red Crossbill**. When we stopped to pick up food at a discount store, I birded a bit in a patch of blackberries near the store. I pished a beautiful **Townsend's Warbler** (a lifer) out of the briars. We "padded" numbers on our Oregon list in Finley NWR in the Willamette Valley. I saw dozens of **Cackling Geese** at the refuge. There were many shorebirds and waterfowl at the site. We spent the night in Eugene and were up early for a visit to Crater Lake.

We did a lot of driving on the 3rd of October to get to Crater Lake National Park but the trip was worth it. The scenery was great. We managed a very cooperative **American Dipper** at one pull off along a mountain stream. We made a stop more or less in the middle of nowhere and were rewarded with a **Red-breasted Sapsucker**. We found a **Prairie Falcon** in the pumice field on the north side of the crater. We ate lunch at the first scenic overlook of Crater Lake and were treated to a low flying **Golden Eagle**. We found good numbers of **Clark's Nutcrackers**, **Gray Jays**, and **Golden-crowned Sparrows** at the Crater Lake recreation area. From Crater Lake we went south to Klamath Falls, Oregon.

We spent the 4th of October mostly in northern California in the Tule Lake area. We found close to 80 different birds. We saw a number of different waterbird species along with thousands of ducks on the various shallow water impoundments in the area. In the course of an hour, we found **Pied-billed**. **Horned**. **Red-neck**ed. Eared, Western and Clark's Grebes! Some highlight birds in California included Sandhill Crane, California Quail, Canyon and Rock Wrens, and Townsend's Solitaire. A Loggerhead Shrike was a big deal for everyone but me. Just across the border in Oregon, Bob spotted a distant raptor. We stopped to watch it and subsequently identified the only Ferruginous Hawk of the tour which dove for a meal in a pasture and remained in the area providing excellent views with our scopes. It wasn't clear if the hawk actually caught something

because a **Red-tailed Hawk** chased it from the site where it had made its attack.

The 5th of October was spent in the Klamath refuge complex in Oregon. That's where we finally managed. after a lengthy hunt, to find a couple of White-headed Woodpeckers including one that "posed" for us on a low snag for a full 5 minutes! On the shores of Klamath Lake we found a mixed flock of feeding songbirds that included both Townsend's and Hermit Warblers. I was fortunate that our tour's co-leader John Puschock spotted a Ruffed Grouse standing on a log in heavy cover about 10 yards off the road as our van moved along at a fair rate of speed. We quickly backed up and the bird staved put long enough for me to get an excellent view of it. We had hoped to find one or more Great Grav Owls but instead, we found a Great Horned Owl. Unfortunately, Great Horned Owls make short work of Great Gray Owls, explaining their absence from one of the best areas for the birds near Fort Klamath.

We traveled north to Portland on the 6th of October. We did a lot of traveling but had some decent waterfowl birding in the Willamette Valley in the William L. Finley National Wildlife Refuge with two highlights. We found a small flock of **Cinnamon Teal** on one pond unit. Later, we searched a small copse of oaks for woodpeckers and found a very colorful **Acorn Woodpecker**.

We had originally planned to spend the 7th of October searching for whatever we could find at Sauvie Island National Wildlife Refuge. However, a **Red-necked Stint** had been reported at Florence on the coast during the week including the day before. So, we took a 3 and a half hour early morning ride to the beach at Florence. A bird that observers "felt good about" did make a pass over our stake out but never landed to permit positive identification. However, we were able to attract a **Wrentit** from the brush around the cove where we waited for the stint and later found a **Wandering Tattler** at the end of a rock jetty to provide two lifers for me. We were also treated to a great view of the tour's only **Rough-legged Hawk** that spent at least 30 minutes flying across the river inlet into very strong winds.

My bird list for Oregon exceeded 175 species. My bird list for California approached 80 species. I missed the one **Green-tailed Towhee**, a potential lifer, that one of our participants saw. However, it is hard to be unhappy about a trip that generated 30 life birds and over 60 year birds not to mention unique animals including seals, sea lions, dolphins, ocean sunfish, whales, deer, elk, tree and ground squirrels, and chipmunks, not to mention legitimate mountains, and

"dormant" volcanoes" sights very foreign to folks from Louisiana.

Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.



A WOODLAND TALE

I was birding my farm, located in the Stonewall Quad, DeSoto Parish, for the Winter Bird Atlas. The morning was comfortable, with temperatures in the fifties, and only scattered clouds floating around the morning sky. It was February 9th, 2007, and I had already put in enough hours for the quad to qualify. It is convenient to live in your Winter Atlas Quad. I was pishing for birds, and had a **Hermit Thrush** wagging, and acting in that distinctive **Hermit Thrush** standoffish manner, when I noticed a big lump on a limb about 100 yards away. It was hairy and on a long, downward sloping limb about halfway up a big water oak tree. It was a most unusual sort of porcupine-appearing lump. Maybe the fact that I have never yet seen a wild porcupine caused me to think of that poor comparison.

A couple of **Blue Javs** watched silently, but did not approach. After a few minutes of close observation, however, I discerned one raccoon separating from the other one, and she slowly crawled down the limb. Then a Tufted Titmouse appeared and flitted around the second raccoon that had not vet moved from his location, which had been atop the first raccoon. The Tufted Titmouse took several bills full of raccoon fur from the lower back area of the second raccoon during the next few minutes. The raccoon totally ignored the bird, or maybe by then he just didn't care. Perhaps he didn't even feel the gentle removal of his fur. reminded me of the dignity of a yellow cat I used to During nesting season when the Northern **Mockingbird** attacked the cat's tail as we walked together toward the milk barn, the cat never

acknowledged the attack, even though it was often bumped into by the flying bird.

LABird, the LA birding listserv, has recently had tales about brave **Tufted Titmice** plucking fur from cats or long haired dogs. Paul Dickson even saw one taking fur from the back of a raccoon. There was speculation about late January and early February being mating season for Louisiana raccoons. This appears correct, as verified by my woodland tale.

The Birdhouse Network: A Decade of Dedication

-- Citizen scientists keep tabs on the lives of nesting birds

From the Cornell Lab of Ornithology

For 10 years, a network of dedicated birders has made it their mission to help birds by providing nest boxes where birds can raise their families and by recording information for scientists. Together, they've kept a decade of meticulous records about when the birds build their nests, how many eggs they lay, and when the gawky fledglings take their first flights. Combined, they have sent nearly 70,000 nest records to The Birdhouse Network, a citizen-science project of the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. These efforts have helped expand scientific knowledge about bluebirds, Tree Swallows, House Wrens, and other cavity-nesting birds for whom the motto may be rephrased, "Hole Sweet Home."

- Getting Oriented: Using records from participants, scientists have examined factors that affect the success of nesting birds across time and space. They have found, for example, that in northern latitudes, nest boxes facing east or northeast produce more fledglings. The hypothesis is that cavity entrances facing toward the sunrise remain warmer on cold spring mornings, increasing survival rates. In contrast, the orientation of the nest box has no effect in southern latitudes.
- Some Don't Like it Hot: A significantly higher number of eggs fail to hatch in the South than in the North. Researchers are investigating whether prolonged warm temperatures cause some of the eggs to start developing before the female begins incubating, leading to abnormal development. Birds in warmer climates tend to produce more broods perhaps to balance the loss. Scientists will be keeping close tabs on rates of hatching in the face of global climate change.

The Birdhouse Network also invites participants to help in a special study called Personality Profiles. Participants follow an experimental protocol and observe how birds react to harmless novel objects placed near nest boxes. Scientists use the information to learn more about birds, such as why some species fare better in cities or around people. They invite anyone interested in animal behavior to help by joining the study.

People of all ages and skill levels can be part of The Birdhouse Network. "Without the data sent in by participants, we would not be able to track large-scale trends in the reproductive cycles of these birds," says project leader Tina Phillips. "Whether they monitor one box or 100, our participants are so dedicated to the birds, and the data they provide us year after year are incredibly powerful."

Remembering Horace Jeter

Horace Jeter, northwest Louisiana's Dean of bird watching, died on January 7, 2007 at the age of 85. Horace was the north Louisiana go-to guy in bird matters for the entire later half of the 20th century. Founder and long time compiler of the Shreveport Christmas Bird Count, Louisiana's longest running CBC, Horace was famously skeptical. You had better have your sparrows straight before turning in that CBC list. Many who knew him well attended the 1975 Spring LOS meeting where a giant 20 lb. dictionary titled "Horace Jeter's comments on Louisiana Bird Records, vol.1, Loons through Grebes" was presented as a new LOS publication, a funny tongue-in-cheek jab at Louisiana's strictest auditor of birds. Horace, with his brief case bar, was a Louisiana bird fixture in his time and regular at AOU meetings in the period 1950-1975. Though a CPA with an MBA from Harvard, Horace preferred to count birds so he stopped counting money in 1965 and went to full time birding in Louisiana and around the world, until age and declining health slowed his pace. He was a close friend of George Lowery and other LSU ornithologists of his time and an early board member and president of LOS. A Shreveport native, Horace Jeter helped to found the Shreveport Society for Nature Study, now known as the Bird Study Group. He was quoted and pictured in innumerable articles in the

Shreveport Times regarding birds. His publications in national ornithological journals mostly documented rare or newly established nesting birds of this region ranging from Scissor-tailed Flycatcher to Western Meadowlark. His brief stint as a wildlife cinematographer led the SSNS to sponsor numerous nature films locally. His filming in the 1960's included some of the first intimate footage of nesting and foraging American Dippers in the Rocky Mountains.

Most of Horace's time was spent in the field recording birds or at home in his library studying them. Through years of field work, at Lowery's request prior to the publication of LOUISIANA BIRDS, Horace filled some significant gaps in Louisiana bird knowledge. Little was know of birds in north Louisiana in 1950 and even Cameron was to be the location of many of his important sightings. On the Sabine CBC he was given the coveted Hackberry Woods area because of his mastery of inland birds. No western vagrant in cryptic winter plumage would get by his studious eye. The cynic always, Horace complained bitterly that he was driving all that way to count Yellow-rumped Warblers. His detailed accounting of field trips remain in pencil in spiral-bound field journals. When a new book on birds in Louisiana is published, Jeter's data will be prevalent in that work as well. His carefully recorded data survive.

A child of the Great Depression, Horace was frugal, living a modest lifestyle. For the last 40 years he lived in a small house on a simple street and drove the same 1965 mustang. He ate at home unless invited out and packed sandwiches on field trips. He spent money only on basic needs and travel. He used the same 8x35 Bushnell binoculars all that time from Cross Lake to Cameron to the Australian Outback. When he could no longer use them, he gave them to me including the original box that they came in and all the paperwork in it, yellowed but in otherwise mint condition. Several years ago, realizing that he could no longer travel, he donated his estate worth over \$1,000,000 to the Louisiana Nature Conservancy, their largest gift to date. His binoculars and his love for nature survive.

Larry Raymond has two stories that he likes to relate about Horace. "In the late 1970's and early 1980's, Horace and I birded together frequently. At some point he asked me to check the water level in the battery of his orange Mustang. I did and, sure enough, it needed water. From then on, he would ask me to check his battery every few months. On several occasions, I tried to show him how simple it was to check and add water to his battery, but his reply was always the same: 'I don't need to know how. I know you and you know how, so you can do it for me'. Another time, on February 17, 1982, I followed Horace to a cottage on

Toledo Bend, owned by a Mr. Quinn, to see a Bandtailed Pigeon. When we arrived, Dr. Newman was already there and Bruce Crider had his spotting scope zeroed in on the bird. We easily added it to our Louisiana list. Later that afternoon, Horace called me to say that he decided we couldn't count the bird because it could be an escape. My reply: if you don't want to count it, that is fine, but it is already on my list and there it will stay. All I can say is: Horace was Horace until the end. One day I may write a book about all of the eccentric naturalists I have known over the years. Horace Jeter was one of a kind and certainly left a positive lasting impression on my life."

George Lowery trusted Horace with describing the status of the species found in northwest Louisiana for Louisiana Birds. If that doesn't speak clearly enough allow George Lowery to speak through the inscription he placed in Jeter's copy of the first edition of that book. It is written in Lowery's hand in black fountain pen and dated 21 September, 1955: "To Horace H. Jeter-whose contributions to ornithology in general and to our knowledge of the birds of northwestern Louisiana in particular are paramount, and who, above all, is one of the finest guys I have known. George Lowery Jr."

Horace was my birding mentor, helping me begin my life list at age 6 and remaining my close friend and "old professor" through his last week. I spoke with him three days before he died and we talked about going out the following week to check on some empids that Terry Davis found that have remained along Red River. He reminded me that though they could be western species, Least is most likely and that they should be scrutinized and perhaps collected. He went into *Empidonax* detail as if I hadn't heard it before. How many empids has he sorted through but still the excitement in his voice spiked through the cloudy shroud of advanced age. He cared that they be correctly identified and recorded for publication. He was always meticulous, as an accountant is, to record only what he saw, not what he wanted to see or what he expected to see but just what he saw. If he didn't see or hear enough to discern a species, then the bird was recorded to genus no matter how much he wanted it otherwise. Every time I look to identify a bird, Horace Jeter's glare is in my mind, making sure that I don't let excitement extend over science. Jeter was a disciplined observer. His lessons survive.

Though Jeter published in ornithological journals, he never allowed himself to be called an ornithologist. He would remind you that his degree was an MBA. Horace toted his binoculars before the term 'birder' was coined, before birding was cool. Instead, he was proud to take the moniker of "bird watcher". Horace Jeter achieved greatness in his chosen niche. I'm glad our paths crossed

as they did and I treasure the knowledge that he offered me. Many of you never knew him but since you are bird watchers too you will cross his path many times, at the "Secret Place" and "Hackberry Woods", off of San Francisco Bay amongst shearwaters, or on a misty Australian mountainside where Lyrebirds display. You may bird in a precious piece of Louisiana native habitat saved with his gift to TNC. You may read across his path too, in which case it will be marked by the observer's footnote: (HHJ, 19..).

Jeter's Bird Records

The Bird Study Group has received 31 notebooks of Horace Jeter's bird records for addition to the BSG Bird Database. Dating from June of 1950 to almost the present, these data represent about 57 years of birding information, most of which predates the BSG Database beginnings in 1986. Before this we had very little information about early birding in our area.

Jeter's records are amazing and extremely valuable for several reasons often overlooked and unappreciated in today's computer age. He used detailed locality information, usually including latitude and longitude for each locality. Often visiting 7-10 places a day, he never failed to record the exact locality. Another common feature of almost all of his records was some information about the weather including cloud cover, wind, rain, and temperature (usually including the high and low for the He often recorded the time when birds were singing and if it was early in the morning he frequently would note when sunrise occurred that day. More than half of his observations include data in addition to the number of birds seen. For example, if we record 46 species during an outing to a specific place we are accustomed to record 46 species and 46 corresponding numbers of birds for that locality, and that is all. More than half of Horace's 46 records would also include items including: sex, age, molt condition, nest building, feeding, preening, courtship behavior, aggression, and many other kinds of observations. All of this information (as much as four lines or text) is included in the BSG Database.

Another of the great birders in our area is Jim Stewart, now residing in The Woodlands, Texas (near Houston). Jim transferred a small part of his records for the Shreveport area to us about three years ago. Both Jim's and Horace's data represent the earliest bird records in the BSG Database for the northwestern Louisiana area. With the inclusion of these records we have one of the most important bird records databases in the country. The possibilities for research and new

discoveries about the bird life of northwestern Louisiana are much greater with such a vast amount of information.

I am a little over half finished typing in the data and have added over 8,500 records (bringing the BSG database to 191,546 records). My goal is to have this process completed by April 20. As soon as all of Jeter's records have been included in the BSG Database, the notebooks will be transferred to the Museum of Natural Science at LSU Baton Rouge.



Claiborne Parish Field Trip by John Dillon

On May 19, the Bird Study Group sponsored a field trip to Claiborne Parish hosted by M.E. Lewis and led by John Dillon. Those present for the trip were Linda Adrion, Jerry Bertrand, Sarah Hancock, Jay Huner, Silviera Hunt, Jim Ingold, Martha Lennard, Nora McClure, Nancy Menasco, and Rosemary Seidler. Also present were M.E.'s two Yorkshire Terriers, Tobey and Wheeler, honorary mascots of Claiborne Parish birding.

The total for Saturday was 76 species, and the morning was spent on Old Colquitt Road, just northeast of Homer. For members who have never birded this area, it is a 10-mile road which begins from Highway 520 out of Homer, crosses the riparian habitat of Beaver Creek, cuts through the West Caney District of Kisatchie and dips into Middle Fork Bayou bottom before reaching the village of Colquitt. The area offers fairly diverse habitat, producing anything from Yellow-crowned Night Heron to Greater Roadrunner.

Beginning at the southern end of Old Colquitt Road at about 8:15, we quickly picked up good numbers of **Prairie Warbler**, **Yellow-breasted Chat**, **Orchard Oriole**, and **Indigo Bunting** as well as several lingering **Cedar Waxwings**. Present in smaller numbers were **Common Yellowthroat**, **Blue Grosbeak**, **Gray**

Catbird and others, including a flyover Yellow-crowned Night Heron and Great Egret.

A mile farther at Beaver Creek, we immediately heard Red-eyed Vireo and American Redstart. Beaver Creek is a reliable place to find American Redstart, and we heard at least 4 singing in the treetops. Nesting neotropical migrants such as Hooded Warbler and White-eyed Vireo were present but already very quite. Soon, birding picked up a bit, and we were able to find Yellow-billed Cuckoo, Eastern Wood-Pewee, Redshouldered Hawk, Ruby-throated Hummingbird, Pileated Woodpecker and an Anhinga soaring overhead.

Making brief stops in Kisatchie before reaching Middle Fork Bayou, we added **Summer Tanager** and **Black Vulture** to the day's list and picked up more **Hooded Warblers**, **Red-eyed Vireos** and Chats.

Just before Middle Fork Bayou bottom, there is a trail to the right of the road that leads downhill into a ravine with dense foliage. After a heavy rain this area is very good for warblers, having produced **Swainson's Warbler** and **Worm-eating Warbler** on the previous two weekends. The caveat is that you may feel like you're starring in a commercial for Deep Woods Off. Of course, any dedicated Louisiana birder should already be accustomed to losing a pint or two of blood on the weekends; so, no big deal, right?

No Swainson's or Worm-eating this time, but we did get Black and White Warbler, Pine Warbler, Kentucky Warbler, and Louisiana Waterthrush. Those of us who made the scramble down the hill to the ravine can attest to the latter two birds. The waterthrush responded to a taped Swainson's Warbler call. Responded may be a bit of an understatement, though; some of us thought that he had convinced himself that he had heard the call of the last female Louisiana Waterthrush on the planet. He was a pleasure to see and hear, singing his long social call for us several times.

We ended our northward trek on Old Colquitt Road at Middle Fork Bayou bottom, host to some very large Basket Oaks and Bald Cypress. It is also host to **Northern Parula** and **Yellow-throated Warbler**, both of which made appearances almost immediately. John Dillon had **White-breasted Nuthatch** here the previous weekend, but they had obviously decided to abscond with the **Swainson's** and **Worm-eating Warblers** this morning.

Making our way back to town, Linda, Silviera, and John were in the lead car and had the luck of seeing a **Greater Roadrunner** live up to his name. The rest of the caravan stopped but had no luck. Linda spotted an **American Kestrel**, though, while the rest of us were hoping the roadrunner might pop out of hiding. Jay

Huner, who needed the species as a year bird, came back to the same location in the afternoon and was pleased to find the bird there. No coyotes were reported in the area, however.

Next, we had lunch at M.E.'s house on Lake Claiborne. Everyone (everyone, that is, except Tobey and Wheeler, who were not offered a crumb) was treated to true Southern hospitality, eating delicious chickensalad sandwiches and fig preserve cake on the back porch while hummingbirds buzzed around us and **Redheaded Woodpeckers** flashed across our views of the lake. On a stroll to the edge of the water, Jay found a **Spotted Sandpiper** bobbing his tail on the seawall. And on the previous night, those staying at M.E.'s guest house were treated to a singing **Chuck-wills-widow**.

We ended the day with a trip to the LSU Hill Farm and Experiment Station off Highway 79. There, we had great looks at **Dickcissel**, **Lark Sparrow**, **Eastern Kingbird**, **Mississippi Kite**, and a **Common Nighthawk** who was on the prowl a few hours early. A pair of **House Finch** brought our total to 76, but Nancy and Jerry stopped by Miles Road the next morning and picked up **Painted Bunting** and **Northern Bobwhite**.

If you've never birded Claiborne Parish, or if you've got a yen to bird alongside Yorkshire Terriers, we hope you'll come by and see us. Just wait till summer's over, though, like maybe November.

Evaluation of Migratory and Resident Bird Populations in the Mouton Cove Area, Vermilion Parish, Louisiana Post-Hurricane Rita Saltwater Surge

From September 2002 through April 2005, we surveyed the birds in the agricultural wetlands, pastures, and riparian forests in the Mouton Cove area of Vermilion Parish, Louisiana several times a month. The study area was more or less circular and had a diameter of about 5 miles. We generated a seasonal bird checklist at the end of 2004 and a report on the birds of the Palmetto Island State Park site at the end of June 2006. In all, some 240 bird species were recorded and 72 species either nested or were probable nesters at or near the study area.

This work was supported by grants to J. V. Huner as Director of the University of Louisiana at Lafayette Crawfish Research Center. Funding agencies were the Louisiana Crawfish Promotion and Research Board and the Coypu Foundation (2002 into 2004) and the Louisiana Office of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism (2004 into 2005).

The study area includes three numbered sites on the coastal birding trail developed by the State of Louisiana - "The Nation's Wetland Coastal Birding Trail".

In early October 2005, Hurricane Rita generated a storm surge that inundated the study area south and in some places north of Louisiana Highway 82 with full strength sea water. Significant damage was done to vegetation. Crawfish and rice fields that were flooded with salt water could not be used for their intended crops. In areas spared from the surge, crawfish fields that would have been filled in the fall of 2005 could not be filled because farmers depend on surface waters that were too saline to pump into ponds for the freshwater crawfish. The problem was exacerbated because the area suffered a drought into the winter of 2005-06 so rainfall was not available to fill ponds unaffected by the surge or flush ponds from which salt waters had been drained in October or November.

Musumeche made several visits to the study area during the period November 2005-March 2006. Huner visited the area in spring 2006. The avian fauna was dramatically reduced in terms of numbers of species and numbers of individuals per species compared to baseline data developed from September 2002 – June 2005.

In 2006, we submitted a proposal to the Coypu Foundation for a one year follow up survey of the study area. We did so because the area provided important habitat for a number of birds prior to Hurricane Rita; it was an important component of the state's coastal birding trail; and the short term impacts of Hurricane Rita on the area should be documented.

The Coypu Foundation Board of Directors agreed to fund the study, administered through the Louisiana Wildlife Federation and we began our survey work in January of this year (2007). Our surveys will continue through December of this year.

Resident, wintering, and neotropical nesting bird numbers and diversity were reduced in the 12 month period immediately following Hurricane Rita. Wintering waterbirds were clearly impacted immediately following the hurricane because much of the ag wetland habitat was dry for lack of rain water to fill fallow fields. There was also a lack of surface freshwater to fill fields for crawfish production and flush salt in areas impacted by the salt water surge that reached LA 82. The area experienced a severe drought in the fall and winter of 2005-06 and salt water lingered for a long time in the normally freshwater canals used for irrigation.

So far, however, we have found good numbers and diversity (197 species as compared to the earlier survey total 240 species) during the first five and a half months of our survey. Many of the fields that were dry during the fall-winter-spring of 2005-06 were flooded in the fall

of 2006. Farmers flooded the fields to leach accumulated salt from the substrate and/or to produce crops of crawfish. Crawfish production was generally poor for the 2006-07 season but the full complement of waterbirds, especially waterfowl, associated with the area in our past survey work was well represented. We were especially impressed with the continued presence of large numbers of scaup, joined by unexpected Redheads, in the shallow 6-10" deep fields. We were pleased to find expected species and numbers of shorebirds present during spring migration. A complete report on the results of our survey work will be published in the Louisiana Wildlife Federation Magazine by mid-2008.

Changes to the Checklist of Birds by Mac Hardy

There have been a few changes to the bird fauna of northwestern Louisiana based on the most recent AOU Supplement (Forty-seventh Supplement to the American Ornithologists' Union Check-List of North American Birds, Auk 123(3):926-936, July, 2006). These changes are reflected in our Field Checklist (dated May 25, 2007).

This one is sure to keep you up at night. The sequence of some sandpipers has changed (you will have to scan an inch or so of the checklist to find your bird). The new sequence is **Spotted Sandpiper**, **Solitary Sandpiper**, **Greater Yellowlegs**, **Willet**, **Lesser Yellowlegs**. Yeah, you read it correctly.

Here we go again. The sequence of terns has changed. The new sequence is: **Sooty, Least, Caspian, Black, Common,** and **Forester's**. For both of these groups, the group stays in the same place in the checklist.

Now, for the really significant change. Delete **Ringed Turtle-Dove** from our bird fauna.

The Field Checklist has been revised and is now available.

NORTH AMERICAN MIGRATION COUNT REPORT 2007

by Hubert Hervey

Each year it is fun to tinker around with the bird count numbers, and see if any conclusions can be seen. This years' count was very similar to last years count in many ways, so I'd like to just compare these two years,

2007 and 2006. We put twenty people in the field this year, compared to 23 last year. We were able to get coverage on the Red River both years. Any year without a boat on the river, is a low count year. I want to thank all of the participants, you did a good job. We had 153 species counted in 2007, and that is exactly the same as 2006. That is a very good high count but it will take a monumental effort, and weather favorable to near fall-out conditions, to surpass the 168 species counted in 1998.

We counted 14,527 individual birds this year compared to 10,411 last year. We put in 89 hours, compared to 73 hours last year. Maybe that is why the individual bird count is up this year. The ranking of the species by total birds counted is usually so similar year by year that the changes are easy to detect. (See the chart below)

The increase in **Cattle Egret** and **American White Pelican** is due to the fact that I included the DeSoto Parish portion of Toledo Bend Lake in my route for 2007. I found a nesting heronry, of mostly Cattle Egrets west from Jolly Roger Camp, and the pelicans were located at Circle Drive. I did not go to those areas in 2006. Indeed, many of the 4,116 birds counted in 2007 over the 2006 total were associated with rookeries. The other most notable change was in **Cedar Waxwing**, where a tremendous population existed in Claiborne Parish (525). The most notable loss was in **White Ibis**. I think that in 2006 Paul Dickson was managing his place in Red River Parish just right for a buildup of **White Ibis**. If so, that is the explanation.

This is called a "migration count". So I want to report to you the number of true migrants counted. This list just includes birds that I am almost certain don't nest here and don't remain through the summer as nonnesting birds. Of the 153 species in both 2007 and 2006, only 24 were true migrants this year, and 26 in 2006.

The similarities and differences year by year are interesting.

2006 True Migrant List: Black-bellied Plover 2, **Upland** Sandpiper 3, Hudsonian Godwit 5, Semipalmated Sandpiper 5, White-rumped Sandpiper 5, Pectoral Sandpiper 15, Stilt Sandpiper 16, Buff-breasted Sandpiper 1, Wilson's Phalarope 19, Caspian Tern 4, Common Tern 6, Black Tern 22, Yellow-bellied Flycatcher 1, Alder Flycatcher 2, Willow Flycatcher 1, Bank Swallow 2, Gray-cheeked Thrush 3, Swainson's Thrush 34, Cedar Waxwing 221, Nashville Warbler 1, Yellow Warbler 2, American Redstart 1, Scarlet Tanager 3, Savannah Sparrow 2, White-throated Sparrow 1, Rose-breasted Grosbeak 5. Not counting the Cedar Waxwings this is, 26 species totaling 161 individual birds. 1.5% of total birds.

One final observation is that apparently some species of birds can count. Apparently **Cedar Waxwings** excel in arithmetic. How else can one account for the fact that they are so often counted in multiples of 25?


