BIRDING MAINLAND AND COASTAL AREAS OF ALASKA IN JUNE 2007

Common Redshank at Homer Spit was the bird of the trip for my first birding trip to Alaska. This was the first record of Common Redshank in Alaska. However, this species was "plain" compared to species like Spectacled and King Eiders and the diminutive Bluethroat.

I joined a group of seven avid birders in Anchorage on June 15, 2007 and departed on June 30, 2007 after finding 154 state birds, 32 life North American birds, and 88 year birds. Our trip was organized by the Galveston Ornithological Society and led by naturalist Jim Stevenson.

Destinations included Denali National Park, Fairbanks, Dead Horse at Prudhoe Bay, Anchorage and Cook Inlet with its massive mud flats and 20 foot plus tides, the Kenai Peninsula, Homer Spit, and Seward. We crossed the Yukon River and traveled several hundred miles along the great Alaskan pipeline that originated in the tundra at Prudhoe Bay. Our adventure included a ruined tire 40 miles south of Dead Horse with the next "service station" being located at Cold Foot at the southern base of the Brooks Range. While changing the tire, we saw large animals moving toward us in the distance. Naturally, we were concerned about bears but

were relieved to find that a herd of Musk Oxen was approaching!

This was a birding trip but we saw glaciers, mountain peaks, tundra, taiga forest, and many other scenic landscapes. We had no close encounters with bears but did have to "back off" from a young bull Moose. The impressive mammals we found included Brown (Grizzly) Bear, Caribou, Musk Ox, Moose, Dall Sheep, Killer Whale, Humpback Whale, Sea Lion, Harbor Seal, Sea Otter, Porcupine, Arctic Fox, and Red Fox along with various squirrels and a weasel. We missed finding wolves but I personally was impressed with how fast a Porcupine could get off a road when we almost hit one in a curve north of Denali National Park.

The bus trip into Denali National Park was certainly a naturalist's treat. We were especially pleased to have good looks at not only the "expected" large mammals but also Rock Ptarmigans, Alaska's state bird, and two Northern Shrikes and first encountered American Tree and Golden-crowned Sparrows.

Our journey from Fairbanks to Dead Horse took over 20 hours with much of the road being gravel and rough, a problem in a 12 passenger Ford van with very tight suspension. Jim constantly scanned the sky and tops of spruce trees for birds. Even though I was in a back seat, I managed to find our first Bohemian Waxwing on top of a spruce. Because we had such a long trip to Dead Horse, we did not stop very often but found Northern Wheatear and Gray-crowned Rosy-Finch as we passed through the Brooks Range and about 2 and a half hours out of Dead Horse, we stopped at a dip and found two stunning male Bluethroats, one of which was located because it mimicked Jim's "squeaking" on the opposite side of the road. It was very interesting to find Long-tailed Jaegers patrolling the tundra far from the open sea where most birders add them to their life lists. As we approached Dead Horse, a Bar-tailed Godwit burst from the tundra and flew parallel to us long enough to provide good views.

There is almost no night that far north in June and we arrived at Dead Horse with plenty of light. Buildings are set on gravel pads in the tundra that, except for the snow and ice still present, looks just like an oil field in Louisiana's coastal marsh. Pools and ponds are everywhere there and the first birds we found were Spectacled and King Eiders along with Long-tailed Ducks. All drakes were in spectacular breeding plumage. And, nothing really topped the those birds, in my opinion, although Tufted and Horned Puffins that we later encountered in the Seward and Homer Spit areas later in the trip.

The ducks were still present the next day along with other northern specialty birds. We found Common, Rednecked, and Pacific Loons, Glaucous Gulls, Yellow Wagtails, and Snow Buntings. Red-necked Phalaropes were literally all over the place.

Gyrfalcons, Rough-legged Hawks, and Horary Redpolls were specialty birds that we found north of the Brooks Range on the way to and from Dead Horse. Huge herds of caribou grazed close to the highway within 50 miles of Dead Horse, going and coming.

Despite our tire problem, we had enough time at a rest stop at the Yukon River to see Lesser Yellowlegs in the tops of the stunted spruce trees there. They obliged us with their breeding displays and calls. Later, we found a Northern Hawk Owl that perched on top of a spruce and gave us excellent views with spotting scopes and binoculars.

While in the McLaren River area near the origin of the Denali Highway, we had the good fortune to find numerous Arctic Warblers at higher elevation in mountain tundra with good numbers of breeding Wilson's Warblers. Then, at somewhat lower elevations we found several Smith's Longspurs including a male in breeding plumage. We viewed and some photographed the bird over a 10 minute period from a distance of about 30 feet.

After our long reverse trip to Anchorage from Dead Horse we spent almost a week in the Kenai Peninsula area working the national forest lands, coastal areas, and making two boat trips, one short one to "bird rocks" at Homer Spit and another from Seward through Resurrection Bay to the glacier at Kenai Fjord and out to the bird colonies at the Chiswell Islands. The Seward area provided good views of the striking Harlequin Ducks.

Special birds, to me, besides the two puffin species and the Common Redshanks at Homer Spit were a lone Fork-tailed Storm-Petrel and a Yellow-billed Loon, both lifers, Northwestern Crow, and both Red-faced (a lifer) and Pelagic Cormorants. Large flocks of Common Murres and Black-legged Kittiwakes were constantly in view. Jim took us to a wildlife viewing area near the air base at Homer where we found a small breeding colony of Aleutian Terns, a treat after seeing hundreds of Arctic Terns on the trip. We also found a "rare" (for Alaska) male Red-winged Blackbird! Fishermen would have appreciated the huge Halibut at the docks at the harbor.

Forest birds that I was pleased to view (and hear) included Three-toed Woodpeckers, Spruce Grouse, and Varied Thrush. We found a hen Spruce Grouse with its chicks running along a road just after we had viewed and heard several Three-toed Woodpeckers. I was impressed by the ability of the small, hand-sized chicks to fly from the ground and find shelter in nearby trees and bushes. While I had seen several Varied Thrushes in Oregon a year ago, I had never heard their unique bell-toned call. Once heard, it is a call that no one will ever forget. Townsend's Warblers were reasonably common and we had a number of good views of these colorful yellowish warblers. Pine Grosbeaks were somewhat difficult to find but once found, were remarkably approachable and viewable. We searched for White-winged Crossbills and Chestnut-sided Chickadees at different locations on several days. We finally found one chickadee but never found a crossbill although Jim insisted a distant, flying bird was a crossbill.

Along the Kenai coast at Anchor Point we watched several dozen Bald Eagles dispute ownership of halibut offal with far more numerous Glaucous-winged Gulls. Those eagles are "no big thing" for Alaskans! Watching the gull flocks closely allowed us to locate Mew, Thayer's, and Slaty-backed Gulls as well. Because of the extreme tidal range there, we watched large, highwheeled tractors launch and recover fishing boats from the beach.

Trip Conclusion

We visited the world famous Potter Marsh area a total of four times, twice while in Anchorage and twice going/coming from the Kenai area including 30 June at the conclusion of our trip. The marsh walk ways, unfortunately, were closed for maintenance so we had to "catch as catch can" from roadside pull outs along a very busy two lane "main" highway. Lifers were few but there were plenty of "trip" birds encountered there.

We were too early for salmon runs there or, for that matter, most other locations except for one at the state's fish hatchery in Anchorage on the last day where we watched our only American Dipper feeding near 15-20 pound King Salmon waiting to be allowed to get into the hatchery where they had been hatched and nurtured some years earlier.

In hopes of possibly finding White-winged Crossbills we drove to a high altitude park in the mountains overlooking Anchorage in early afternoon on the 30^{th} . We were foiled, however, by the poor spruce cone crop across the region. However, the last new bird of the trip was perched on a power line about half way down, a Townsend's Solitaire.

DUPLICATE BIRD RECORDS

I sincerely apologize to all of our BSG Newsletter readers about the mistake in the last newsletter. All of the bird records in volume 21, number 5 (the last issue of that volume) were the records from volume 20, number 10. There were no errors in the data. In this issue (volume 22, number 1) we present two Bird Reports: the correct volume 21, number 5 report and the current volume 22, number 1 report. I am sorry for the inconvenience and confusion that this must have caused.

BIRD REPORT – compiled September 4, 2007

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.

Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.



UPCOMING FIELD TRIPS AND EVENTS by Nancy Menasco

Beginning birders are welcome on all field trips. Membership in the BSG is encouraged but is not required for participation in field trips. Field trips will **LEAVE** the designated meeting place at the time posted for each field trip. Plan to arrive early for field trip orientation and any carpooling/caravanning arrangements.

What to bring on field trips: binoculars, two-way radios, scope, if you have one, snacks, and drinks. Unless otherwise noted, field trips will take place rain or shine, so bring rain gear if the weather's threatening.

THE BIG SIT!

C. BICKHAM DICKSON PARK (RED RIVER EDUCATION AND RESEARCH PARK) SUNDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2007, BEFORE DAWN 'TIL AFTER DARK

Founded by the New Haven, Connecticut, Bird Club and hosted by <u>Birdwatcher's Digest</u>, this will be the 15th Annual Big Sit. Swarovski Optik donates \$500 to the team who gets the "Golden Bird," a bird selected by random drawing from all birds sighted. The winning circle then chooses a non-profit environmental-based organization to be the recipient of the \$500.

For the seventh straight year, BSG sitters will sit the Big Sit at C. Bickham Dickson Park. Last year's total of 50 species was the lowest total since we began sitting in 2001 except for the Big Sit of 2004 when it rained all day. We have reported a total of 97 species in six years: 2001 - 53 species; 2002 - 68 species; 2003 - 70 species; 2004 - 39 species; 2005 - 70 species; 2006 - 50 species. The Big Sit officially begins at midnight and ends 24 hours later; BSG sitters have always been in the field by 6:30 a.m., manning the circle continuously until at least 7:30 p.m. Any Sitters wishing to man the circle before 6:30 a.m. will need to contact Nancy Menasco so we can make arrangements to let you in the gate.

Sitters may come and go at will. Park in the parking lot next to the old horse barn. Signs will lead you to our circle. The circle will be in the field around the first curve of the gated road that leads to the back of the park. We will have access to the restrooms in the old office building. After two-and-a-half years, LOS returns to Cameron Parish! The Cameron Motel is open and has about 50-60 rooms. The next closest lodging is in Lake Charles. Another nomination had been made where Mac Hardy would be President and Amanda Crnkovic would be Vice President. However, each of them declined those positions. Nominations closed July 7. Board members voted by email and on July 19, the president disseminated the results of the vote: President, Amanda Crnkovic; Vice President, Mac Hardy; Secretary, Jeff Trahan; Treasurer, Jean Trahan.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

September 11, 2007, 7:00 p.m. Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Program – The first speaker of the year was Mac Hardy. The title of his talk was: "A View from Wallace's Line." He talked about a trip he took this August to Borneo, Malaysia, and Indonesia. Mac could not complete his presentation because of problems with the computer projection system.

Meeting Time – The president, Amanda Crnkovic, said that she would like to start the meeting one-half hour earlier. A motion was made to serve refreshments at 6:00 p.m. and start the presentation at 6:30 p.m., beginning with the October meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.

Least Terns – Hubert Hervey reported that he continued to do Least Tern surveys on the Red River. He was on the river ten times this season and saw a total of 41 terns and very little evidence of nesting. On the July 4 survey of the Red River, no terns were found from Index, Arkansas, to the Mississippi River. The reason for the lack of terns is that the river has been very high during May, June, July and August, and the sand bars which provide nesting spots for the terns have been under water.

Field Trips – Hubert Hervey said that the annual fall hawk watch would take place on his farm on September 22. If you go you should think about bringing a side dish. You must tell Hubert that you will be there so that preparations can be made for the watch. Nancy Menasco reported on other field trips. The Haynesville Butterfly Festival will take place September 22 in Haynesville. The spring LOS meeting will be held in Cameron Parish this year on the last weekend of October. The meeting will take place in Creole, LA. The LOS winter meeting will be held in Alexandria. Finally, the Big Sit will take place in Bickham Dickson Park on October 14.

Hospitality – Amanda Crnkovic reminded everyone that she is the hospitality chair in addition to being president. She suggested that we should do hospitality differently this year. She asked that volunteer club members be responsible for refreshments at meetings. She passed around a sign-up sheet so that club members could sign up for a specific meeting at which they would be responsible for refreshments.

Membership – Mac Hardy has asked members to pay their dues. He reported that there are 205 active members.

Newsletter – Jim Ingold provided many excuses for the newsletter being late for the first meeting. He said that it should be on time from now on.

Publicity – Amanda Crnkovic said that the club needs someone to be chair of the publicity committee and asked if someone would volunteer. Rachel Demascal volunteered.

Bird Talk – John Dillon reported a Cooper's Hawk outside of Raising Cane. Roy Henderson said that he saw a totally white dove or pigeon in the field near Lowes that had a tuft on its head and a band across its tail. Jean Trahan reported many herons, egrets ibis, and peeps at Bickham Dickson Park. This has occurred because of the high water in the park providing habitat for these birds. She said that you would have to walk into the park from the locked gate to see the birds. Nan Franks saw Canada Geese near Champion Lake. Nancy Menasco reported that this last summer was a great summer for **Baltimore Orioles**. She said that you have to be in the river bottom land to be able to attract these birds and she explained how she did that using a hummingbird feeder. Steve Bankston saw a Greater Roadrunner on LA5 between Kickapoo and Keatchie.

BIRD STUDY GROUP

BIRD REPORT – compiled October 3, 2007

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.



The annual winter meeting of the Louisiana Ornithological Society returns to central Louisiana. With only a two-hour drive, hopefully many BSG members will be able to attend. There will be field trips on Saturday and Sunday. Planned are trips to Cheneyville for Sandhill Cranes, Catahoula Lake, the NSU Aquaculture Research Center, Lost Bottoms Bayou and Kincaid Lake, and several Grant Parish National Forest locations for Red-cockaded Woodpecker.

The program on Friday night will take place at the Clarion Hotel and will include presentations by Laura Palasz on her research on Henslow's Sparrows in Louisiana and Jonathon Valente on his research on King Rails in Louisiana. The Saturday night banquet and program will be held at the Cajun Landing restaurant. Steve Shunk will speak on woodpecker conservation, including the trends of the Red-cockaded Woodpecker in Louisiana as well as in the U.S. He will also speak on RAMSAR sites, including where they are and their significance.

REPORT OF LEAST TERN SURVEYS, 2007 By Hubert Hervey

Ten trips on the Red River by boat were made during June, July, August and September, 2007 by the reporter. The main focus of report for this season is that the extreme rain event of this summer caused the failure of Least Terns to nest on the Red River. This is the first time known to me of such complete failure.

In June, 41 Least Terns were counted, primarily in pairs sitting on the flat topped buoys of the navigation channel. Thirty-two adult Least Terns were present in Pool 5 waiting for the water level to lower and sandy islands to emerge. Some of these birds were seen on one strip of sand near Hamel's Park. Two birds were counted flying near the Hwy 2 Bridge, where a very small sandy spit was all that remained of a location where thirty-two terns had nested in 2005. Six birds were present in Pool 2 at the Boyce colony location where one bird had scraped a nest in the highest peak of the dredged gravel, but no eggs were present. Two days later, this site was under water. In July, nearly all terns had left the river by the 23rd of July as high water continued. Four Least Terns were counted near Shreveport, in Pool 5. None were present anywhere else in the survey area from Doddridge, Arkansas south to Alexandria, Louisiana. You will have noted that the number of terns reported here is hundreds of birds less than any previous report.

In August, the count was run late in the month in hopes the water level had fallen enough to reveal suitable nesting habitat, but the counts run on the 27th and 28th showed that all Least Terns had left the river. A count was made in Arkansas on August 23rd and 24th covering about 100 miles of river from Index south to the state line. No terns were observed, however, seven islands that had been used in previous years by nesting terns were emerging to a height of one to two feet above river level. These islands were in excellent condition, scoured clean by the spring and summer high water conditions, with no vegetation remaining. These should provide excellent nesting habitat for a few years.

My opinion is that this summer's rain event over the Oklahoma and Texas portions of the Red River Watershed amounted to at least a 100 year event. Ernie Etheredge, Red River and Hydrologist Specialist with the US Department of Commerce, Weather Service in Shreveport, in personal conversation, called this summer's high water event, a 500 year event. Only one time in history, 1849, do records exist for a similar sustained summer-long high water level on the Red River. "At the very least, the summer high water level during 2007 for the months of May, June, July and August, represent a 160 year interval between comparable high water levels at this season," said Ernie Etheredge.

Gulf South Research of Baton Rouge does the Least Tern Survey of the Red River from Denison Dam to Index. In conversation with their biologist, I learned that they did not run any surveys this year due to the high water. He stated that their past experience shows there would be no exposed sand as nesting habitat for Least Terns. My surveys of the Red River from Index, Ark to Boyce, La, combined with the Gulf South biologist's convince me that it is safe to say that no Least Terns were raised on the Red River in the summer of 2007 from Lake Texoma to the Mississippi River. A very high probability is that no nesting occurred anywhere, neither Oklahoma nor Arkansas. However, river levels along the huge nesting colonies of the Mississippi River were satisfactory for the terns to nest. As a result of this year's nesting failure, a unique opportunity exists for next year. That is, to determine the annual loss of adult least terns, since no young were added to our area population. Sandy islands, higher than in previous surveys, have been reported by Wildwood Dean in the Texas, Oklahoma areas, and I have seen beautiful, clean scoured islands in both Arkansas and Louisiana since the water have receded. This year's survey was supported by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries.

BSG Big Sitters Carry On the Tradition

This year's Big Sit, held on Sunday, October 14, 2007, at C. Bickham Dickson Park in Shreveport, saw the absence of many of our regular Sitters but those of us who remained found the strength to carry on anyway. Sitters, or Standers, this year included Charlie Lyon and Dennis Forshee, who were first to arrive on the scene, followed by Jerry Bertrand and me, and then Paul Miliotis, Jeff and Jean Trahan, Kevin Hunter, Mark Wilson, Terry Davis, and Amanda Crnkovic-Lewis. Laura (whose last name I don't know), who had heard about the Sit at the Bird Study Group meeting, joined us about 6:45 a.m. for a couple of hours.

The first bird of the day was **Eastern Screech-Owl** at 6:26 a.m. The usual scenario regarding the time period of the first observation of a species held true again this year. Fifty species out of a total for the day of 64 species were either seen or heard by 9:00 a.m. At 11:10 a.m., 56 species had been counted when the mid-day doldrums set in. Paul Miliotis and I were left to hold down the fort and not until over two hours later did the 57th species, **Anhinga**, materialize. Kevin Hunter joined Paul and me shortly afterwards but another two hours would pass before the 58th species, **Red-shouldered Hawk**, made a brief appearance. It was so quiet that at least two of we three Sitters took a nap during the seemingly interminable wait between sightings.

We would average a little better than one species an hour for the next five species, **Northern Harrier**, **Cliff Swallow**, **American White Pelican**, **Western Kingbird**, and **Green Heron**. During that period, Jeff Trahan rejoined us followed by Terry Davis and Mark Wilson. Amanda Crnkovic, whose wedding to Jerome Lewis took place the day before the Big Sit, demonstrated her commitment to birding and science by showing up for the last hour or so of the Sit. The last bird of the day, **American Woodcock**, was spotted by Jeff at 7:15 p.m.

BIRD STUDY GROUP

For the first time in the seven-year history of the Big Sit at C. Bickham Dickson Park, both **American Crow** and **Cooper's Hawk** are missing from the list although we did add seven new species. And while several species, including **American Robin** and an assortment of woodpeckers, kept us company most of the day, the woods surrounding us were mostly unproductive. The Chinese tallow trees that have gradually replaced the open area of tall cottonwood snags and willows along the road beside the Sit area were almost completely devoid of birds. You can find the complete list of species counted this year, including numbers and time of day (in 24-hour time) a species was first observed, on the chart included in this newsletter.

BIRD REPORT – compiled October 31, 2007

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park. Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the

responsibility of the observer.



The annual winter meeting of the Louisiana Ornithological Society returns to central Louisiana. With only a two-hour drive, hopefully many BSG members will be able to attend. Minutes of the Regular Meeting October 9, 2007, 6:30 p.m. Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Program – Janis Harrison discussed her 2005 birding trip to Colorado.

Field Trips – Nancy Menasco said that the Big Sit would take place Saturday, October 14, in Bickham Dickson Park. Also on the agenda was the open house at the Red River Refuge Headquarters Unit on Saturday, October 20. At the open house Larry Raymond will give a talk on attracting wildlife with plants and Paul Miliotis will give a talk on dragonflies.

Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park. Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the

responsibility of the observer.



The Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) is eleven! The annual four-day count has expanded past the backyard to include anywhere you choose to bird. It's free and birders of all ages and degree of expertise can participate. We encourage you to consider getting involved this year. To learn more about the count and to enter your reports, go to www.birdsource.org/gbbc.

The BSG database lists over 175 species that have been found in our area in the month of February, including rarities. Download a February (or any other monthly) checklist from the BSG website at www.birdstudygroup.org/SelectMoCheck.html.

Complete instructions for participation are available on the GBBC website, but the guidelines are simple: For each day of the count period, report the highest number of a particular species recorded at each location you bird. For example, on day one of the count, in your backyard you have one **Northern Cardinal** at 10:00 a.m., five at noon, and two at 2:00 p.m. You report five **Northern Cardinals** for your backyard (the highest number present at one time) for day one. You go birding the same day at C. Bickham Dickson Park, where you spot six cardinals for C. Bickham Dickson Park. You start all over again for days two, three, and four.

Record entry is easy. Go to www.birdsource.org/gbbc and click on the icon "**Submit your bird checklist**" near the top of the page. Fill out the questions about your location, local habitat, and count duration. Then enter your high counts for each species sighted for that day and location. You can submit one bird checklist for each day that you count or for each new area that you count in. For example:

- If you count on four days at one location, you'd submit four different checklists.
- If you count on four days at two different locations each day, submit eight checklists. And so on.

Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.



ELEVENTH ANNUAL GREAT BACKYARD BIRD COUNT

The Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) is eleven! The annual four-day count has expanded past the backyard to include anywhere you choose to bird. It's free and birders of all ages and degree of expertise can participate. We encourage you to consider getting involved this year. To learn more about the count and to enter your reports, go to www.birdsource.org/gbbc.

The BSG database lists over 175 species that have been found in our area in the month of February, including rarities. Download a February (or any other monthly) checklist from the BSG website at: www.birdstudygroup.org/SelectMoCheck.html.

Complete instructions for participation are available on the GBBC website, but the guidelines are simple: For each day of the count period, report the highest number of a particular species recorded at each location you bird. For example, on day one of the count, in your backyard you have one **Northern Cardinal** at 10:00 a.m., five at noon, and two at 2:00 p.m. You report five **Northern Cardinals** for your backyard (the highest number present at one time) for day one. You go birding the same day at C. Bickham Dickson Park, where you spot six cardinals for C. Bickham Dickson Park. You start all over again for days two, three, and four.

Record entry is easy. Go to www.birdcount.org and click on the icon "**Submit your bird checklist**" near the top of the page. Fill out the questions about your location, local habitat, and count duration. Then enter your high counts for each species sighted for that day and location. You can submit one bird checklist for each day that you count or for each new area that you count in. For example:

- If you count on four days at one location, you'd submit four different checklists.
- If you count on four days at two different locations each day, submit eight checklists. And so on.

ABOUT THE BIRDS AND THE BEES By Hubert Hervey

The old man remembers happy days as a boy sitting on the front porch of the old home and watching the Chimney Swifts. They nested in the brick chimney that was responsible for keeping much of the house warm in the winter. This was summertime, and the living was not exactly easy, but it was good. They didn't even know they were living in the "good old days", but compared to today . . . they were. Just before dark the swifts would fly in a circular pattern, with the chimney as the approximate center, and then pitch into the dark sooty area below to spend the night on their hard mud nests. Nests brought in small, muddy beak full by small, muddy beak full following showers when mud could be found. Their chattering was a pleasant sound, in those days before television dominated the night sounds.

The Chimney Swifts (birds) definitely had a strong attachment to the honey bees (bees) living in the hollow oak tree directly in front of the porch swing where the boy often sat. There was an opening in the leaves of the tree that the boy was watching. The bees had to return to their hive by crossing that opening. The birds knew this. The birds and the bees were on a collision course. Flying full speed ahead the swift would open its mouth very wide, and a bee would splat on the back of the birds open maw. No time to activate the stinger, just *sphlatt*.

WILD BIRD CENTER EVENTS

This happened all day long, to a seemingly endless supply of bees. He knew a little about the birds and the bees.

As the boy grew older he acquired some pigeons. He enjoyed listening to them, as the male strutted about cooing to the female of his choice. Billing and cooing was invented by pigeons, copied by people. He built a special pen for his pigeons behind the hen house, where they would be safe from owls, and other night predators. He also looked forward to the time of eating fried squab. He had heard that the dark meat was as good as Morning Dove, and you didn't have to worry about biting down on a bird shot pellet. As we will see, he never found out if squab was good or not.

He learned about bee keeping. He had a dozen bee hives he would rob every summer. This provided sweetening for the many desserts that his mother prepared for the family of five. A sixth was to come along later. The aviary (birds) was located a little in front of the apiary (bees), in the pecan orchard. His mother had developed a special recipe for pecan pie, using honey from his bees and pecans from the orchard. He had to protect the pecan crop from the marauding crows. They would carry off the entire crop if not held in check with the aid of a shotgun. A hive of black bees had been successfully removed from a post oak tree in the wood lot. The tree had been split into fence posts by a tenant farmer. He learned to waste nothing on the farm. The wild bees had delivered many a sting to the boy as they defended their queen and honey supply, but he managed to get them moved to the apiary.

The time for collecting the honey had arrived. The boy filled his smoker with soiled rags, and got a good smoke going with every puff of the bellows. He wore his sting proof gloves, bee hat and veil, and coveralls carefully tucked inside his rubber boots. He thought he was safe, even from the vicious wild bees. All went well with the tame, yellow, Italian bees. Puff smoke, let bees calm down, open hive with hive tool, remove frames loaded with honey, brush off bees, leave frames with brood comb, and replace removed frames with new frames filled with wired foundation wax. No problem; until he got to the black bees' hive. The smoker just barely held the angry bees at bay as they peered through the cracks between the frames at the top of the hive. Five thousand pairs of eyes watched and waited for a chance to fly out and employ five thousand stingers in protection of their queen and honey (God and Country). The unforgettable sound of angry buzzing bees increased. A gap in the

cloud of smoke showed the black bees an opening. His coveralls had a slit in the side for access to inside pants pockets. It was summer and all the boy had on under the coveralls were his BVD's. Seeing this weakness in his defense, the bees swarmed in promptly employing those stingers. Forgetting all thought of robbing bees, the boy took off running trailed by a swarm of angry bees. He left many of the bees behind when he ran through a fig tree with its many trunks. This knocked his hat and veil off. Now the remaining bees could attack his head as well as his torso. As he ran, he slung off the thick sting proof gloves. He needed his hands for crushing wild bees. One hundred vards in record time, and the bees still chased and stung. Another hundred vards and he ran out of the coveralls, so he could kill those inside bees. He could not outrun the bees; puffing, he backed up against a big pecan tree trunk. With his backside protected he swatted the bees, until none were left. He had over twenty stings, and his body was reacting badly to so much poison. Within a year, he learned he had developed a severe sensitivity to bee sting poison and had to give up beekeeping.

But the bees were not finished, because this is a story about the birds - and the bees. The bees turned their anger on the pigeons and the birds went into a panic. The boy saw his pigeons flying wildly, followed by lines of bees. There was no escape from the bees. By night time all of the pigeons were dead, stung to death by the angry native black bees. He never raised pigeons again. He returned the black bees to the wild. The boy knew a little more about the birds and the bees, but not all.

Terry Davis then said that he will be leading a field trip to the Shreveport Regional Airport Saturday, January 12, to search for Smith's Longspurs. Terry said that this field trip will involve strenuous walking with little access to restrooms.

Bird Talk—Jeff Trahan reported several good birds at Bickham Dickson Park. They are Surf Scoter, Eared Grebe, Semipalmated Plovers, and Henslow's Sparrow. Rosemary Seidler said that Bickham Dickson Park has plenty of ducks this year. Paul Miliotis reported that he and Matt White saw Vaux's Swifts at Bickham Dickson Park and Matt White obtained good photographs of them. Neither Paul nor Matt heard them vocalize. Jean Trahan reported that she and Jeff Trahan saw some unusual species on the Bossier-Caddo-Bienville Christmas Bird Count. She said that they saw four immature Bald Eagles, Black-necked Stilts, seven Plegadis ibis, and Great-tailed Grackles. Terry Davis said that he and Jeff Trahan got high counts of several birds last week including 648 White-crowned Sparrows in the vicinity of Elm Grove in south Bossier Parish. Jim Ingold reported about 60 House Sparrows at his bird feeders in Bossier City. Ellen Middleton said that she has two Red-breasted Nuthatches coming to her feeders in Broadmoor Terrace.

BIRD REPORT – compiled February 7, 2008

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.



BIRD BANDING AT DICKSON DEER FARM By Jim Ingold

The annual banding of sparrows was held at Paul Dickson's deer farm on Saturday 23 February 2008. Highlight of the day was a **Red-breasted Nuthatch**. Other birds banded included **White-crowned Sparrow**, **White-throated Sparrow**, **Swamp Sparrow**, **Song Sparrow**, **Red-winged Blackbird**, **Yellow-rumped Warbler**, and **Northern Cardinal**. Two **White-crowned Sparrows** that were banded last year as second year birds were retrapped. Besides Bird Study Group members, we were joined by teachers, students and parents of Curtis Elementary School in Bossier Parish. All of the students were able to hold sparrows and they seemed to be having the time of their life.

WAXING AND WANING WITH HUMOR By Hubert Hervey

I got an exact count on the flock of Cedar Waxwings, and there were only 24, not the expected 25. Where was the lost bird? It had forgotten to spread the wax on its wings this morning, got caught in a shower and could not fly until its wings dried out.

It watched the Double-crested Cormorant spread its wings wide to the morning sun, did the same, and soon found its wings were dry. Then the cormorant dived into the water and came up with a fish. The waxwing thought that would be easier than finding a tree full of wild cherries. Besides, the cherries sometimes made it feel woozy, and fall out of the sky, and he didn't believe in partaking of alcoholic beverages. So he dived into the water after an easy fish meal. And a big bass fish had an easy meal.

I heard a thud against the kitchen window. There was a young Carolina Chickadee lying, unmoving, on the porch. Seldom do birds here hit the window so hard as to commit suicide. I went out and picked up the tiny bundle of gray feathers, and set it upright in my hand. It opened its eyes, but would/could not move. So I put it upright on a chair on the porch. Twenty minutes later it had flown back to its parent, full of tales about monsters that swat birds out of the sky, with unseen swiftness.

That night I heard panic-stricken screaming coming from the den, so I rushed in ready for any emergency. I expected to see a seven-foot rat snake that could have come down the chimney, but no, the cat had a Chimney Swift in its jaws. The swift had come down the

chimney, worked its way around the heat-skewed damper, and into the room. Perhaps due to all the screaming, the cat let the swift loose swiftly. Trying to fly off the swift found that the sky had an unexpected top to it, the bird managed to cling to the wall, where I captured it. Upon release, the bird flew off into the dark. The poor cat has never tasted anything but cat food since we rescued it as a starving kitten. It will probably never have a clue as to the good tasting meal it missed. Good old smoky, sooty, tasting bird meat, nearly like KFC used to serve before the competition caused them to have to put more meat on their scrawny chickens. I used to claim they were serving sparrows, but management has assured me they always sold chicken.

NIGHTJAR SURVEY

(The following was posted to OKBIRDS 26 February 2008 – The Editor)

In the spring of 2007, The Center for Conservation Biology constructed the Nightjar Survey Network to begin the process of collecting data on the population distribution and population trends of Nightjars across broad regions of the United States. The Network was initially introduced into the southeast and is being expanded in 2008 to provide coverage throughout the contiguous United States.

The support I have received from many state and federal agency personnel in the Southeast has been great and very helpful. I cannot thank you all enough.

I have added a brief report on findings from the initial year of survey on the project website.

The Nightjar Survey Network relies on volunteer participation by conservation-minded citizens. biologists, and other like-minded groups to adopt and conduct survey routes. Surveys are conducted much like the United States and Canada Breeding Bird Surveys except for important modifications to accommodate the biology of Nightiars. Nocturnal behaviors of Nightiars are strongly influenced by moonlight. Activities such as calling and foraging increase under bright moonlight and breeding may be directly tied to the lunar schedule. The Nightjar Survey Network was designed to take advantage of this life history trait by restricting surveys to bright moonlit nights. This protocol substantially improves the accuracy and precision of surveys by reducing the systematic errors associated with moonlight and will further act to strengthen the statistical power needed to draw conclusions from collected data.

The Nightjar Survey Network has both short-term and long-term objectives that are considered spatially and temporally scalable. As soon as a significant portion of the Network routes are annually surveyed, they will begin to provide results of Nightjar population status for local regions and for broader geographic areas.

Short-term objectives have 4-5 year time horizons and include:

1) Gaining a better understanding of the population distribution of Nightjars across their breeding ranges.

2) Learning how the composition of different habitats in a landscape influences Nightjar abundance.

3) Improving the performance of the survey design.

Long-term objectives have time horizons of 10 yrs or greater and include:

1) Determining the scale and magnitude of population changes.

2) Providing alarm signals at specific locations if Nightjars are becoming imperiled.

I welcome any interest, comments, or suggestions, and any distribution of the program by Southeast PIF members to the general public is valuable. I have also created a 2-page flyer that contains much of the info above as advertisement of the project. This is available for download on the website.

Hubert Hervey said that he saw a western *auduboni* **Hermit Thrush** behind the Stonewall Post Office. Nancy Menasco said that one of her friends reported a **Bald Eagle** nest on Lake Bistineau.

BIRD REPORT – compiled February 29, 2008

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.





Nancy Menasco and Jerry Bertrand found only 12 of the 20 species targeted for the scavenger hunt and still won the competition and the free lunch. The other two teams found 8 and 10 of the species. Overall, the six species (with the numbers seen on this date in the past in parentheses) not found during the scavenger hunt were: American White Pelican (50), Eastern Screech-Owl (2), Pileated Woodpecker (5), Golden-crowned Kinglet (2), Hermit Thrush (9), and Gray Catbird (0). The White-breasted Nuthatch found by the winning team was the first for this date in our database history) was Scissor-tailed Flycatcher (1) by Ingold and Davis. The next least common (4 records each)

species found were **Eastern Phoebe** and **Eastern Towhee**. Thanks to all of the participants and good luck on next year's scavenger hunt.

BIRD REPORT – compiled April 2, 2008

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.



This is the eighth annual North American Butterfly Association (NABA) count for Shreveport. Butterfly counts are very similar to bird counts. This area includes much of southeastern Shreveport, Wallace Lake, Keithville, and a small portion of Bossier Parish. SWAINSON'S HAWKS AND BIG DAY, 20 APRIL 2008

Hubert Hervey and Terry Davis set out early for a day of birding pleasure. By the time we finished our day had totaled 132 species of birds. We birded in Caddo Parish, and finished up in Bossier Parish. The biggest excitement for the day was locating 35 **Swainson's Hawks** in northern Caddo Parish. They were scattered out along the Red River valley farmlands from Sentell Road to near Missionary Plantation. Some of the hawks were on the plowed ground; some were feeding, some took flight as we approached and often soared up into the skies and disappeared to the north. The total of 35 **Swainson's Hawks** is the highest in the Bird Study Group data base. Previous high counts are 19 SWHA John McBride et al. Gilliam Levee Rd, Caddo Parish on April 17, 2005, and 14 SWHA Jeff and Jean Trahan, Robson Rd, Caddo Parish on May 1 2005. All other records are for one to three birds and are from Caddo, DeSoto and Red River Parishes. All records are during spring migration except two in early October during fall migration and one record that Pat and I had on August 15, 2004 of two birds perched in trees by the Red River north of the Highway 2 Bridge, suggesting the possibility of a nesting population in north Louisiana.

I also suspect that 132 species in one day is a pretty decent number for a two parish Big Day. We started in Bossier City, Stoner Woods, Cross Lake, then north to Dixie, up the River Road to Missionary Plantation on Arkansas line, the crossed over to Wardview area to finish up the afternoon. We had only four duck species, all the bitterns and herons except Tricolored Heron, ten raptors, eight sandpipers, four doves, four vireos, seventeen warblers, and nine sparrow species. There were good movements of Eastern Kingbirds, Indigo Yellow-rumped Buntings, Warblers, Warbling Vireos, Nashville Warblers, and Lark Sparrows. New arrivals included **Dickcissels**, several warbler species, Painted Buntings, American Bittern, three Least Bitterns, and Yellow-breasted Chats. Late lingering species were Northern Harrier, Virginia Rail, Sora in large numbers (34), Brewer's Blackbird, and Swamp Sparrow. Best birds not yet mentioned included Blackcrowned Night-Heron, Osprey, both yellowlegs, Sprague's Pipit (8), Golden-winged Warbler, Tennessee Warbler, Prairie Warbler, Swainson's Warbler, and Grasshopper Sparrow (6) at the sod farm. An Osprey flew by The Cove on Cross Lake with a yellow bass (sand bass), it perched in a tree, and was then harassed by Fish Crows, and relocated several times. The complete list has been entered in the BSG data base.

Hubert Hervey said that he and Terry Davis saw a **White-tailed Kite**, three **Bald Eagles** and a **Swainson's Warbler** in the Wardview area in north Bossier Parish Thursday. Mac Hardy reports **Great-horned Owls** calling nightly at his house. Ron Martin saw two **Mississippi Kites** yesterday.

Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.



Next Meeting – June 9, 2008 PANAMA'S CANOPY TOWER & CANOPY LODGE MR. CLYDE MASSEY

JUNE PROGRAM

When: Tuesday, June 9, 2008, 6:00 p.m. Where: LSU in Shreveport Museum of Life Sciences

In October 2007, I traveled to Panama with VENT in search of tropical birds. Our base of operations during the first week was the fabulous Canopy Tower, a renovated radar station in the heart of the rainforest in Soberania National Park near Panama City. Looking out from the top of the canopy tower offers a unique view of the surrounding rainforest and its birds. Many of the canopy species can be observed at eye level and the views of the surrounding mountains and the Panama Canal are breathtaking.

The second week we traveled about 60 miles west of Panama City to a town called El Valle, where the Canopy Lodge is located. This new lodge was built from the ground up by Raul Arias de Para, who also renovated the Canopy Tower. Its location is higher in elevation than the canopy tower and offers a different group of birds. The Canopy Lodge has feeders that allow close views of many tropical birds. Panama has over 900 species of birds in a compact geographic area which makes finding birds rather easy. Central Panama, along the Canal Zone, boasts a high number of species with a mix of Central and South American birds. Its modern infrastructure combined with a growing interest in ecotourism make birding a pleasure.

Please join us at the June meeting as we explore the forests and birds of Central Panama.

NORTH AMERICAN MIGRATION COUNT COMPILES 16 YEARS by Hubert Hervey

It is hard to believe the BSG has been participating in the NAMC for sixteen years. Time flies when you are having fun. It began in 1993 when I agreed to head up the NAMC effort for Caddo Parish, and has since expanded to a count encompassing most of northwestern Louisiana. We usually have six parishes to report. I believe it was in 1994 that the LOS had the leader of the NAMC as a speaker and he told us that he always wanted to be a ruler, so from now on we could consider him as King Stalsz. He said we could expect a book on the results in about ten years. I am fully aware that we who expect books about birds to be published in a timely fashion in Louisiana are doomed to be disappointed. I have written my book, not much about birds, in a period of three months and it is now at the publishers. I have tried to "Google" up NAMC and have met with defeat; it is located there but defies my efforts to update any real data related reports from national headquarters. So I keep on reporting our NAMC data to Marty Floyd and wondering when we can have some published results to our efforts. The first two years I received published hints at some of the new findings that were being unveiled by the NAMC, such as circum-gulf migrating species and trans-gulf species, but those reports dried up.

I have decided that we have enough data for our area that I will compile what I can and give you some meaningful findings. You are free to draw your own conclusions, but I may add a few thoughts as we go along. Warning: this is a more detailed report than I have given to BSG in the past.

We can tell that the first two or even three years we were getting to know our areas and how to get the best areas covered most thoroughly. 2008 was second (162 species) only to 1999 with 164 species. What is amazing about this year is that we had nobody on Red River, which always gives us several exclusive birds. We were fortunate to have birds grounded by weather that was followed by north winds so the migrant birds remained in greater numbers than usual. The table above can be our guide for how well we are doing in future years. Although I can't prove it statistically I am also convinced that we have better numbers if our count is scheduled during the first half of the possible time frame.

The next table shows our fourteen highest count species. We have more colonial nesting birds now than in 1993, and this clearly shows up in the tremendous increase in **Cattle Egret**, and **Cliff Swallow**. I am always encouraged to see resident nesting species such as **Northern Cardinal**, **Northern Mockingbird**, **Carolina Chickadee**, and **Mourning Dove** holding a fairly steady count over this length of time. I see our species of concern as being **Purple Martin**, **Eastern Kingbird**, and perhaps **Indigo Bunting**.

Heron rookeries are located at Mibermel (near Powhatan), Lock and Dam 4 entry road, and Cross Lake Dam. We did not count rookeries at Long Lake in Red River Parish nor the Bayou Pierre Wildlife Management Area DeSoto Parish unit. The Mibermel rookery is now host to six pairs of **Great-tailed Grackles** nesting among the herons and egrets, and two pairs of Tree Swallows nesting in cavities on the south end of the lake. These rookeries add to numbers of **Little Blue** **Heron**, **Anhinga**, and even **White Ibis**. The decline in **Great Egrets** is due to deterioration of the rookery at Buzzard Island on Cross Lake. **Dickcissel** numbers vary with the progress of haying operations, as they require tall grass for nesting. When conditions allow the number is high.

The **Cliff Swallow** story is most amazing, with colonies located at LA 2 Bridge, Lock and Dam 5 and 4, Jimmy Davis Bridge, Coushatta Bridge (not counted) and I-220 at Red River and Cross Lake. The decline in 2004 occurred because of illegal shooting at Cattle Island that caused desertion of the nesting area with a reluctance to return evident also in 2005.

The five year averages in the last two columns are interesting to study as trends can be readily seen. Note: 2004 was used in both averages because it was abnormal enough to skew either set if not included in both.

Other noteworthy species were **Purple Gallinule** (3), White-winged Dove, Swainson's Hawk, Yellowheaded Blackbird, and Bobolink.

Bird Talk—Amanda Lewis reported that the **Cassin's Sparrow** was still present the morning of this meeting. Ron Martin said that there may be a **Mississippi Kite** nest in one of the tall trees at the A. C. Steere School grounds. Linda Adrion at first thought she saw a bear in Claiborne Parish, but it turned out to be two **Wild Turkeys**. Silviera Hunt spotted a **Baltimore Oriole** nectaring at her hummingbird feeder. This was a new species for her yard.

For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.
